Year To Date Financial Results

Lower than anticipated patient volumes in both inpatient and outpatient services have generated poor financial results year to date through July. We are currently tracking 65 fewer than expected inpatient admissions, 445 fewer ER / Urgent Care patients and 8,900 outpatient procedures less than budgeted. Due to these lower volumes, we are \$3 million below our Gross Revenue Budget expectations for the year.

We've also experienced higher than anticipated expenses as well. This is due to a higher number of patients who cannot or will not pay, therefore increasing our bad debt expense, as well as higher than anticipated employee health insurance claims. We are currently \$450,000 over budget on our expenses. This has generated a -2% operating margin for the year.

Although this is a national trend that many of our peers are facing today, we must continue to look for ways to operate more efficiently and grow our patient volumes in order to sustain positive financial performance.

Hocking Valley Community Hospital receives Auditor of State Award

A recent financial audit of Hocking Valley Community Hospital by the Auditor of State's office has returned a clean audit report. HVCH's excellent record keeping has earned it the Auditor of State Award.

"HVCH's clean audit confirmed a strong foundation that allows for accurate financial reporting and clear checks and balances that help to ensure we keep healthcare in Hocking County. We believe that good financial governance translates into better service delivery to our patients," HVCH CFO Julie Grow said.

The Auditor of State Award is presented to local governments and school districts upon the completion of a financial audit. Entities that receive the award meet the following criteria of a "clean" audit report:

- The entity must file timely financial reports with the Auditor of State's office in accordance with the GAAP (Generally Accepted Accounting Principles);
- The audit report does not contain any findings for recovery, material citations, material weaknesses, significant deficiencies, Single Audit findings or questioned costs;
- The entity's management letter contains no comments related to:
 - Ethics referrals
 - Questioned costs less than \$10,000
 - Lack of timely report submission
 - Reconciliation
 - Failure to obtain a timely Single Audit
 - Findings for recovery less than \$100
 - Public meetings or public records

"Congratulations on receiving the Auditor of State Award," David Yost, Ohio Auditor of State, said. "My office looks forward to continuing to work with you to ensure a clean, accountable and efficient government for all Ohioans."

Be prepared for a flood situation

Know your Risk

Flooding is a temporary overflowing of water onto land that is normally dry. Flooding may happen with only a few inches of water, or it may cover a house to the rooftop. Flooding can happen in any U.S. state or territory. Flooding can occur during every season, but some areas of the country are at greater risk at certain times of the year.

Basic Safety Tips

- Turn Around, Don't Drown! ®
- Avoid walking or driving through flood waters.
- Do not drive over bridges that are over fast-moving floodwaters. Floodwaters can scour foundation material from around the footings and make the bridge unstable.
- Just 6 inches of moving water can knock you down, and one foot of moving water can sweep your vehicle away.
- If there is a chance of flash flooding, move immediately to higher ground.
- If floodwaters rise around your car but the water is not moving, abandon the car and move to higher ground. Do not leave the car and enter moving water.
- Avoid camping or parking along streams, rivers, and creeks during heavy rainfall. These areas can flood quickly and with little warning.

Flood Watch = "Be Aware." Conditions are right for flooding to occur in your area.

Flood Warning = "Take Action!" Flooding is either happening or will happen shortly.
