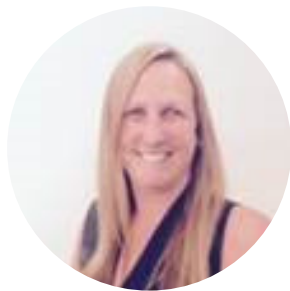

EPR by Stealth: Smoothing the way for Paper Free Clinics

A Chief Clinical Information Officer is a standard job title in almost all Healthcare Trusts in the United Kingdom. Why did we need them?
