

Assets School is for students 5-18 years of age. We specialize in serving children and young people whose capability is greater than their achievement and those who are in need of acceleration and enrichment. Counseling and behavior management are central to an Assets education and are integrated into all programs.



APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Summer School

1. Complete application and intake forms
2. Attach copies of evaluations:
 - a. A measure of cognitive function (IQ range) within the last three years
 - b. Recent standardized achievement testing e.g., (SAT, ERB)
 - c. Current and last year's report cards
3. Teacher reference report(s) submitted by teacher. The necessary testing may be obtained through the Department of Education or private professional services.
4. Forward application and all evaluations to Assets School to the attention of the Registrar.
5. An interview with the Administration will be arranged to determine acceptance into the Summer School program.

Students already enrolled at Assets need only complete the Summer School application.

While summer enrollment does not guarantee acceptance into Assets' fall session, it does provide an optimal opportunity for students, parents, and the school to evaluate whether or not Assets is an appropriate placement for a particular student. For fall enrollment, priority will be placed on enrolling appropriate applicants from the summer program on a space-available basis.

Academies

1. Complete application and intake forms.
2. Teacher reference report submitted by teacher. Note that these academies are not a pathway into the fall program.

APPLICATION DEADLINE: Applications will be reviewed beginning January 2017. Admissions for summer program are rolling and will remain open as long as space is available. Applications received after enrollment is full will be placed on a space available waitlist.

The summer academic program includes an integrated curriculum. Literacy instruction is focused on multisensory, structured language approaches such as Slingerland, Orton-Gillingham, Project Read, and Read Naturally. Theme-based Math and Science lessons are integrated via hands-on activities that engage students and promote enthusiastic, meaningful learning. Students also attend daily Enrichment classes that are designed for them to explore their interests and develop their strengths. Students new to Assets may receive supplemental assessment which provide valuable information about the student's learning profile.
