Technology Update

Parent accounts...

The new school year brings the brain-taxing task of remembering what parent accounts and passwords you have for access to school information. Remember to keep these account separate from student accounts. For progressbook, you create your own ID and password and connect it to your children, as well as creating your children's accounts. If you aren't sure what your account is, you can click the "Forgot the username or password" link and it will email reset information. For

Blackboard, the parent account is the student ID preceded by the letter "p" (for parent) -- like p770024. You should change your password under personal information after you first log in. If you are unable to log in to Blackboard, please email Arline Pique (arline.pique@indianhillschools.org) to reset your password.

- **Quarter End – Where do you find grades?**
- Blackboard shows all course grades during the quarter when you login (in addition to being able to access classroom assignment information and documents, as well as lunch balance information and other announcements). To get to the detail behind the grades, simply click on the grade displayed by a course name.
- Progressbook shows grades, attendance and report cards. At any time you can login and see current course grades or attendance. Furthermore, once report cards are “printed” you will find them under the REPORT CARD area. In the “View Paper History” link (top right corner of the Report Card screen), you can view and print the official Indian Hill Report card that is current, or from previous years since this feature was implemented. This is helpful for scholarship applications, insurance discounts, etc.
- While the Blackboard parent account is automatically created for each family, the Progressbook parent accounts must be created by the parent. If you never created a Progressbook Parent account, you will need to contact Guidance ([Mrs. Karen Post](#)) for your parent registration key. The key allows you to connect your student to your account. For more information on creating your Progressbook Parent account, see:

- **Students and Cell Phones**
- The High School has an open policy regarding cell phones as compared to the Middle School. Students are allowed to use their cell phones in the hallway during class changes, during MP periods and during lunch. They must ask permission to use their cell phones during class (and sometimes the teacher will allow students to use their cell phones for certain apps during class). Please note, however, that if you allow your child's phone to be a mobile hotspot, they are NOT allowed to use that feature during school.
- We encourage you, as parents, to stay aware of what your student is doing on their cell phones; it is a powerful device that has the potential to cause severe harm if used inappropriately. Check their photos, texts and apps occasionally. While High School is a time for us to prepare them for the independence of college and the "outside world", it is still important to stay diligent in helping to teach them safe practices using these electronic tools.
- Also, you might want to be aware of this **"secret photo" app** that looks like a calculator app to the average person but allows people to hide photos they don't want others to know

about: <http://petapixel.com/2015/09/05/district-attorney-warns-parents-about-sneaky-photo-hiding-apps/> Children are using this app across the country to hide photos they don't want their parents to see. So, please be aware.
