October 9 EBC Housing Rally, Grace Brooklyn Heights Chapter Report: Forty Grace parishioners rallied at City Hall in pouring rain on Columbus Day to force Mayor de Blasio to build senior housing and improve living conditions at New York City Housing Authority developments. The rally, organized by East Brooklyn Congregations, of which Grace is a member, drew more than 5,000 people to the gates of City Hall, where NYCHA tenants spoke of a lack of security, constant leaks into their NYCHA apartments, and a NYCHA management indifferent to tenants' needs. An EBC pastor told the rally that Mayor de Blasio had not committed to EBC's plan to build 15,000 units of senior housing on surplus NYCHA land. To keep pressure on the mayor, Public Advocate Letitia James told the rally she would hold a candidates' forum for all City Council Speaker candidates at St. Paul Community Baptist Church to ask them to commit to EBC's NYCHA plan.
