We will be reading Walk in Love: Episcopal Beliefs and Practices (Forward Movement, 2018), by Scott Gunn and Melody Wilson Shobe. It is available in print and e-book from Amazon.

Rector's Tuesday Bible Study will resume on *Tuesday, October 2*, from 10:30 am to 12:00 pm in the Choir Room.

The Study of Christian Themes and Symbols in Southern Literature, led by The Rev. Dr. Allen F. Robinson, begins October 3. In an era of religious and cultural pluralism in America, the study of southern writers continues to grow with a renewed sense of intrigue and discovery. In this class, we will study the works of three southern Christian writers in an effort to discover the power and use of Christian symbols in literature. We will seek to understand the presence or seemingly absence of God, the role and purpose Christ and the unifying work of the Holy Spirit as experienced through these important pieces of literature. What role, if any, does the faith of the writer play in each work? For instance, Flannery O'Connor was a devout Roman Catholic and used her numinous religious experiences as the cornerstone for many of her books and letters. So, then why does many of O'Connor's writings reflect an existential understanding of the Holy? Lastly, it is my hope that each participant will be able to experience the presence of the Holy in new ways as a result of having read these profoundly spiritually-insightful writings. This course will take place each Wednesday evening during the month of October in the *Hope Library*, from *7 to 8:30 pm*.

I would encourage participants to read each book ahead of class as we will launch into discussions at the beginning of each class.
