Welcome/Orientation Dinner at a hotel

Sunday

Visit Shaare Zedek Medical Center in Jerusalem

- Attend lectures on characteristics, demography, and epidemiology of MCI's
- Participate in hospital preparedness drill
- Tour Jerusalem

Monday

Drive to Sderot

- Observe the Gaza Strip and its proximity to Israeli towns and villages
- Visit Acute Stress Reaction Center
- Attend lectures at Magen David Adom EMS facility

Tuesday

Visit Rambam Medical Center in Haifa

- Attend a lecture on the vision and future concept of emergency preparedness
- Tour the innovative underground hospital
- Meet with Israeli colleagues

Wednesday

- Receive hands-on training at the Israel Center for Medical Simulation
- Visit the Magen David Adom National Dispatch Center

Thursday

- Visit the new Medical Corps training base in the Negev, including the simulation center
- Course ends with a graduation ceremony at the Latrun Commemoration site
