Through this workshop, Dr Lawson will explore the idea that there are specific learning styles associated with people on the autism spectrum. This compelling presentation will examine the specific cognitive processes utilised by individuals on the spectrum to comprehend and make sense of their world, and discuss how these differ from the processes of the neurotypical population.

Dr Lawson will pose questions including why do many people with autism avoid eye contact, and why do they often insist on routine and sameness? Why is there the need to shape and/or alter the world they live in, and why do people on the spectrum often experience difficulties with generalised learning?

He will also provide practical tips, advice and strategies drawn from his unique personal and professional perspective, assisting participants to better understand autism and learn:

- About autism and dual diagnosis, learning disabilities, dyspraxia, ADHD and Pathological Demand Avoidance (PDA) disorder;
- What school and work are really like for someone with autism;
- Practical tips, strategies and advice on how to support a person on the autism spectrum;
- About communication and sensory dysphoria;
- About sexuality, gender and gender dysphoria;
- How to support and empower people on the spectrum to live the lives they choose; and
- What the future may look like in the eyes of individuals on the spectrum.

This workshop is certain to offer both insight and inspiration. Packed full of useful tips and strategies to support people on the spectrum, and those around them, the program aims to empower people with autism to live the lives they choose.

## PRESENTER

Dr Wenn Lawson is one of the most highly respected professionals in the field of autism - both in Australia and internationally. He combines lived experience with professional knowledge, drawing on everything from his First Class Honours in Social Work to a Doctorate in Psychology.

A public speaker for more than 20 years, Dr Lawson published his first book on autism, 'Life Behind Glass' in 1998. He has since published a further 15 books and numerous research papers.

At the age of two, Dr Lawson was misdiagnosed with an intellectual disability, and at school he was accused of being incapable of doing as instructed. When he was 17, he was again misdiagnosed - this time with schizophrenia. Dr Lawson was also admitted to mental health facilities on a number of occasions. He was correctly diagnosed (at the age of 42) with an Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC), ADHD, dyspraxia and learning difficulties.

A participant and advisor for Autism CRC, and a teaching fellow with the University of Birmingham's Masters in Autism (online), Dr Lawson is a member of the Autism Open Access board, the board of Warrnambool College's Select Entry Accelerated Learning (SEAL) program, and the board of Innovative Community Action Networks (ICAN).

Individuals on the spectrum, family members, care givers, educators and professionals - anyone who is striving to achieve improved outcomes for themselves or for individuals on the autism spectrum.
