**NON-VETERAN TRANSPORTATION:** Non-Veterans of Citrus County may travel to the Villages Outpatient Clinic with veterans as seating capacity permits: Veterans have first priority. There is a fee of \$10.00 for this service (this fee is not applicable to persons traveling as escorts of veterans).

**DEPARTURE FROM THE VILLAGES:** All passengers must be ready to leave no later than 2:00 P.M. It is the passenger's responsibility to be aware of the departure time as well. The bus cannot wait for late arrivals. If all scheduled passengers are finished before the 2:00 P.M. departure time, the bus will leave as soon as all passengers are ready.

**MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS:** Veterans need to have their appointments scheduled for a Wednesday or Thursday. This bus service is only available for the dates listed on the other side.






## Landscape Professional Workshop Planned for October



The Board of County Commissioners recognizes August 21, 2018 as John W. Hull Day in Citrus County and calls the observance to the attention of all citizens.



### Southwest Florida Water Management District Temporarily Closes Airboat Slides in Citrus County



The Southwest Florida Water Management District (District) has temporarily closed the Brogden Bridge at Turner Camp Road and Wysong-Coogler airboat slides in Citrus County due to safety concerns associated with high water levels.

Attempts to use the slides in current conditions could damage airboats or injure passengers. Staff will continue to monitor conditions and will reopen the slides as soon as practical.

The District operates one additional airboat slide in the area, the Moccasin Slough slide. It is currently open but could be temporarily closed as conditions change.

## CR491 Roadway Shift Announced



Vehicular traffic on CR491 is set to be shifted to the newly constructed roadway pavement immediately following the Labor Day holiday, weather dependent. This new traffic pattern on CR491 will be from just north of SR44 to West Audubon Park Path. Traffic shift is to begin at approximately 9:00am and be finalized by approximately 3:00pm on the day of the shift.

Project Variable Message Signs have been placed to notice the traveling public of the date the New Traffic Pattern will be in place. Variable Message Signs have been placed to announce lane shift and any schedule changes.



### **Library Hours to Change on October 1**

Beginning October 1, 2018 the Citrus County Library System will be open at 9am at all five branch locations, Monday through Friday. The Central Ridge branch in Beverly Hills, Lakes Region branch in Inverness, and Homosassa branch will be open on Saturdays from 10am until 4pm. The Coastal Region branch in Crystal River and the Floral City branch will be closed on Saturdays. All branches will continue to be closed on Sundays. The table below includes complete details of hours changes including varied closing times throughout the week.

The change in hours allows for the Library System to shift personnel to the busiest locations and times throughout the county while maintaining current staffing levels. "The addition of the 9am opening hour has been a long-time request of many patrons at all locations," said Eric Head, Library Director, "this change will allow us to shift our staff where they are requested most and maintain good overall coverage county-wide."
