"BEIT TZITIT"

A SHABBAT BEGINNER'S SERVICE AND TORAH DISCUSSION PROGRAM AT KBI

If you walk down the stairs from the lobby or the social hall at Keneseth Beth Israel around 10 am on a Saturday morning, you are liable to walk into a unique Jewish experience in the Richmond community. A diverse group of people from varied backgrounds gather together for one purpose: a beginner's prayer service that allows individuals to pray at their own pace, including those elements of the service with which they are the most familiar, followed by a Socratic style discussion, facilitated - but not led - by a young, local rabbi.

"For me, it's the only way to pray," one of the regulars told this reporter after services one Shabbat morning. "I can say more or less. I can focus on what is meaningful right now. It's special."

Elliot Fitzgerald, an attendee for years, member of the board at KBI and coordinator of the program, known as "Beit Tzitzit," says that the content and style of the prayer and discussion has constantly morphed to suit the needs of the attendees. "It is not one of those programs that offers a service and tries to sell it. It really forms from the inside out. People who want something different, something personal, come and participate. They suggest changes. And the discussions allow everyone to contribute instead of just consume."

Rabbi Don Cantor has been the group facilitator since 2014. "This program presents a unique opportunity for people to confront Torah Judaism in a genuine, honest, and thoughtful fashion. Everyone contributes. Everyone gains. We harness diverse viewpoints to understand how G-d and Judaism speak to us," he said. He and his family recently accepted a position as the campus rabbi and rebbetzin at Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore for JLIC, an Orthodox Union affiliate.

SENATE MOVES TO CODIFY OBAMA-ERA AID PACKAGE TO ISRAEL

A Senate panel approved a bill on Tuesday endorsing a decade-long aid package to Israel brokered by the Obama administration, as reported by the Jerusalem Post. The U.S.-Israel Security Assistance Authorization Act of 2018 authorizes a memorandum of understanding negotiated in 2016 between the two governments which will provide Israel with \$38 billion in military aid between 2019 and 2028. A bipartisan majority of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee passed the legislation, allowing it to proceed to the full Senate floor.

The bill also authorized the president to establish a US-Israeli counter-drone program, expand collaboration on the peaceful exploration of space, and produce an assessment on Israel's precision-guided defense needs with respect to threats from Hamas in Gaza, and Hezbollah in Lebanon and Syria.
