Sooner or later we all face trials in our lives where we will want to understand as much as possible. We will want this understanding in order to make a decision, or in order to feel comfortable when we do not get to make a decision, or when we feel lost in a flurry of events which leave us confused. The problem with information is that depending upon the source, our information may change.

As we prepared for my recent valve replacement, there were numerous times when I was provided information. At times, I would question the information because I knew of other people who had a different experience. I found out that some people have been trained to provide the most conservative estimate possible, so that the patient is not disappointed by hopes for the best possible result. While I understand the value of this strategy, it tends to make the patient less optimistic. Other people will share a more hopeful scenario, which certainly sounds good, but does little to prepare a person for the things that may not work well. Why do we end up in these situations?

Perhaps the Oracle – from the movie series The Matrix – sums it up best when she is asked about the future and states, "No one can see past a decision which has

not been made.” We human beings are not able to see the future because it is changing. Similarly Yoda, in Star Wars says, “Future – hard to see, always in motion.” We struggle with this reality, which is why it shows up in our movies as a reflection of life.

Heading into surgery and knowing myself, I knew that once I had enough information, I would be calm. Perhaps more calm than most, or perhaps calm only because I had no choice. Yet, at the last moment, when I was alone and prepped for the procedure a couple of things changed. (More would change while I was asleep.) The doctors were discussing the level of my anesthesia and whether or not I would need a certain procedure during the surgery. Change is frightening and that moment of discomfort came forward. This is when the words above bring great comfort. We can place our hope and our trust in God who knows ALL things.

Just before I was put to sleep, I found out that nothing had changed because the discussion went back to the original plan. When I woke up I found out there were a number of things the doctors did not have to do – and I was very happy to realize this. As much as I wanted to “know everything” I could not, and it was not necessary. God was there to provide the comfort I needed.

I want to take a moment to thank all of the people who receive this newsletter who have prayed, called, emailed, written, or in some other ways brought comfort to me and my family during this recent time of healing. It is clear that prayers were answered and I am enjoying the healing process. May God bless us all with the wisdom and compassion to bring the message of God’s presence to other people in the midst of their times of trial.

Bible Basics by Pastor Tom Norris

The Next Five Books I'm Reading

As the "teaching pastor" at Bethany, most of my teaching here has been focused on the books of the Bible. It is foundationally important to know God's Word and to be able to think through how they inform our faith in order to apply that faith to our lives. However, it's also good to read the books of those who have reflected deeply on the faith in order better to understand how this ancient "faith once delivered to the saints" is also the fresh breeze of life for the world today.

This month, I thought I'd share with you the next five books I'm reading to help me think through some contemporary issues in light of Christian faith. This is also the order I'll be reading them.

Sexy: The Quest for Erotic Virtue in Perplexing Times

Jeff Mallinson

Jeff is a professor at Concordia University Irvine (my alma mater) and co-host of the podcast "Virtue in the Wasteland." In this book he explores a subject the church has had great difficulty addressing in a gospel-centered way our current hyper-sexualized culture.

Monsters: Addiction, Hope, Ex-girlfriends, and Other Dangerous Things

Daniel van Voorhis

Until recently, Dan was also a professor at Concordia University Irvine. Now, along with co-hosting "Virtue in the Wasteland," he serves as Director of the League of Faithful Masks and is Scholar-in-Residence of the 1517 Legacy project. In *Monsters* he shares his own very personal story of dealing with darkness and brokenness and yet finding hope.

How to Think: A Survival Guide for a World at Odds

Alan Jacobs

Alan is Distinguished Professor of the Humanities in the Honors Program at Baylor University. Thinking is hard; especially so in a culture with a 24-hour news cycle fueled by the Outrage of the Day. Jacob wants us to remember how to think, and to think as Christians.

Fear and Trembling (re-reading this one)

Soren Kierkegaard

I read this one in seminary and have been frequently thought about re-reading it. Now's my chance. *Fear and Trembling* is an examination of questions about the source of good and evil through the lens of the story of Abraham being told to sacrifice his son, Isaac.

The Lost World of Genesis One: Ancient Cosmology and the Origins Debate

John H. Walton

Walton is professor of Old Testament at Wheaton College. Here he explores the creation story in light of other creation stories from the ancient near east to explore what the Biblical creation story has to say about the nature of the creation, creation's God, and how we understand the world in which we live.

I'm also going to be doing an online book study of one of these, which one I haven't yet decided. When I make up my mind I'll let you know which one and how to join in on the online study.

Women's Ministries

The mission donation for May will go to St. Anthony's Padua Dining Room

This mission is close to home, located on Middlefield Road in Menlo Park, and close to our hearts. St. Anthony's Padua Dining Room first opened its doors in 1974 to serve the low-income elderly with a weekend meal supplement in a social and friendly atmosphere. However, the need quickly grew into a daily operation.

Hot Meal Program – The Dining Room helps to answer the needs of its local community by providing, hot, nourishing meals Monday to Saturday year-round to all who come seeking a meal and a safe place to eat. On holidays – Christmas, Easter and Thanksgiving, their patronage nearly doubles, rising to as much as 1,200. Daily between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m., patrons are provided with a buffet-style well-rounded lunch that is served by volunteers.

Groceries – The Dining Room provides surplus basic foodstuffs, fresh fruits and vegetables as well as bread products to patrons in paper and plastic grocery bags. This service allows their guests to transport and prepare fresh meals at home. Items vary daily but typically include a mix of bread, pastries, canned and packaged goods, as well as varieties of fresh produce.

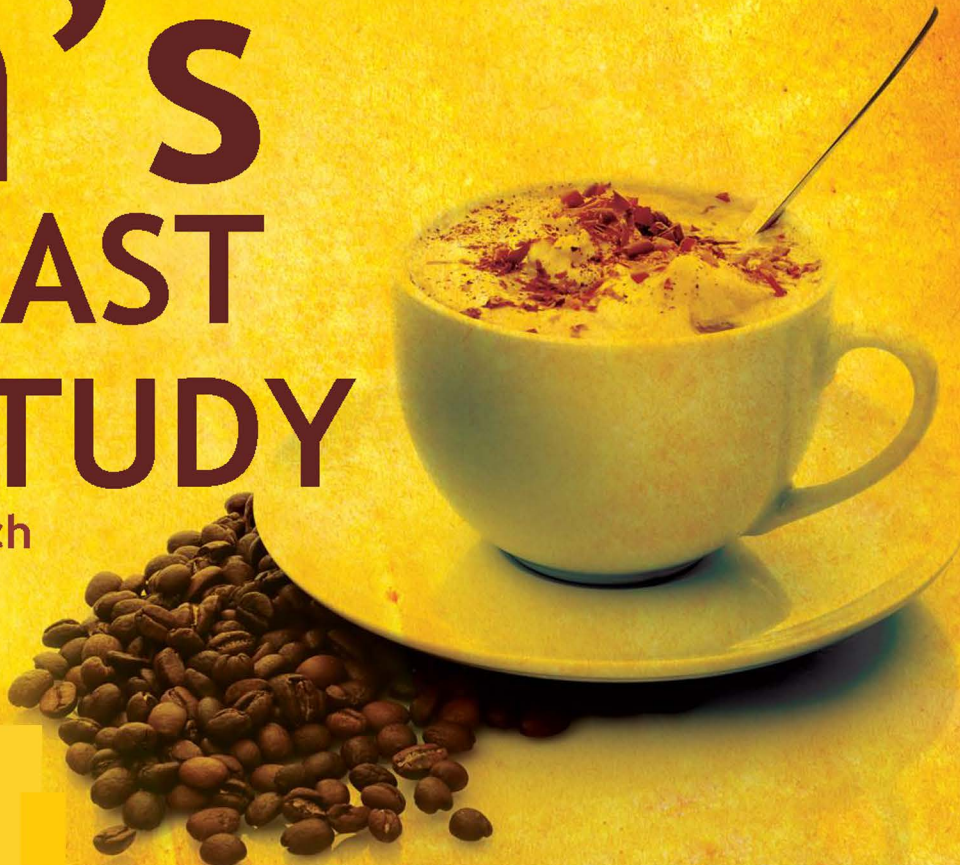
