One of our favorites is Torrado Manor. Since 2005, this 17th-century manor has been home to the “Wine Routes of the World” Museum. While preserving the structure’s original features (gardens, dovecote, hórreo and hearth), it also provides an overview of wines and wine regions. The museum highlights wine routes throughout Galicia, Spain, as well as every continent across the globe, through projections, screens and display cases filled with different wines. Albariño lovers will especially love the rooms dedicated to the region’s signature grape and its special fiesta, the **Albariño Festival**, which takes place every year in Cambados during the first week of August. There’s also a space that pays tribute to the Galician artists who have sung its praises of the wine world via their sculptures or literary works, including Valle-Inclán, Asorey, Rosalía de Castro, and more.
