

Engaging with Aging Conference offers uniquely Canadian view on how community-based organizations can meet the needs of older adults of all ages

The conference presented by the Jewish Federations of Canada and the Cummings Center took place September 18-20 in Montreal, Quebec and offered a wide variety of sessions on older adult services, highlighting the diversity and vibrancy of the aging population in Canada and unique and innovative ways service providers, including JFSs, are working to ensure health and wellness for older adults. Presenters discussed the changing face of aging led by the baby boomer generation, and tackled issues including mental health, elder abuse, volunteerism, end of life care, and working with survivors, to name a few.
