# Tuition Assistance & Scholarships

At Sandusky Central Catholic School, we are blessed to have two types of Tuition Assistance (TA) funds that provide grants to families needing support to afford a Catholic education:

- SCCS Annual Fund provides immediate financial support to current SCCS families
- SCCS Education Foundation designated TA gifts provide on-going annual contributions to the school to assist with family tuition grants.

Scholarships are also available through the SCCS Education Foundation for current and post-graduate students. The SMCC scholarship fund accepts monetary donations of any amount. Named scholarships, with specific donor criteria, can also be established with a minimum endowment of \$25,000.

Because of our generous benefactors, SCCS was able to award over \$215,000 in tuition assistance. The SCCS Education Foundation provided \$67,000 through tuition endowments and an additional \$105,000 in high school and post-graduate scholarships.



# Champion Academic Excellence

SCCS students excel in the classroom, on the field, and in the arts because of our well-educated, caring, and committed teachers. Under the care of these educators, students are afforded opportunities to develop their God-given gifts and talents. Recruiting, retaining, and rewarding excellent educators is a top priority for SCCS as the market for first-rate educators becomes more competitive.

The SCCS Education Foundation's Endowed Chair program, valued at \$2.2 million, awards our high school teachers with bonuses. In response to the success of this long standing program, the Investing in Educators fund was established to provide bonuses in a similar manner to our middle school and elementary teachers. We are grateful to the forward-thinking benefactors that continue to believe in and support Catholic education ministries.

SCCS Education Foundation's Endowed Chair Program awarded \$93,600 in bonuses to high school teachers, an additional \$10,400 was distributed for new Art class drawing tables and drafting stools and funding for off-site professional development. The Investing in Educator Fund raised \$40,000 allowing SCCS to award bonuses to middle school and elementary teachers in just the first year.



# Enhance the Student Experience

In the process, we are able to use these developments to offer advanced coursework, as well as remedial support. SCCS continues to research and develop the latest in curriculum advancements, as well as provide cutting edge technology to our students.




The Good Shepherd program was introduced to further the faith formation of our youngest students. The Panther Performance Center (PPC) was completed, which included private classrooms for one on one tutoring for students, before, during, and after school. Our robotics program added a state-of-theart 3D printer, and the curriculum is now offered in grades four through twelve. The class of 2016 had 30% of graduates enter into a STEM (science, technology, engineering, math) major in college, emphasizing the importance of technological advancements.



# 2015-16 Sandusky Central Catholic School

Sandusky Central Catholic School makes every effort to keep tuition affordable for our Panther families. Tuition from families represents only 33% of school revenue, requiring SCCS to rely on other sources of income. Fundraising initiatives provide the biggest source of outside revenue. The two pillar fundraising events of SCCS, the Winter Gala and the SCCS Auction, raised over \$250,000 in restricted and unrestricted funds. The success of these events is a direct result of dedicated committees leading these initiatives.

Capital improvements are necessary to preserve and enhance our campus. It has been more than one hundred years since the doors opened at 410 West Jefferson Street. There is never a lack of ideas and recommendations concerning improvements, but our sense of stewardship means that we proceed with those ideas that have the greatest impact for the greatest number of students.






## 2015-16 SCCS Education Foundation

or the year July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016, the SCCS Education Foundation received new contributions totaling \$224,408 and distributed funds totaling \$332,400 to Sandusky Central Catholic School and students for the benefit of its programs, tuition assistance, teachers, and scholarships. The ending market value on June 30, 2016 was \$7,287,611. The investment portfolio is closely monitored by an investment committee which meets quarterly to review strategy and progress. Asset allocation is designed to support the short term spending/income goals, as well as provide for longer term growth over inflation.

The disbursements from the SCCS Education Foundation's numerous funds are made annually based on the Board of Director's approved Spending Policy Statement. This policy governs the amount of funds to be distributed annually to Sandusky Central Catholic School and students. Distributions may be further restricted by appropriately authorized Donor Agreements.



### \$2,237,959 Endowed Chair Fund

The Endowed Chair Fund provides funding for SMCC faculty bonuses, professional development, and departmental improvements.

### \$1,693,588 Scholarships

Provides tuition assistance for current SMCC students and 8th grade students entering SMCC through 8 scholarships. Mr. Link, is a 1939 SMCC graduate and a prominent player of the 1936 SMCC State Basketball Champs.

Made up of multiple scholarship and tuition assistance funds designated towards the continued Catholic education of selected students, based on individual donor specifications.

The John & Helen Schumacher Endowment Fund is a renewable scholarship awarded to an above average graduating senior attending college with an interest in Engineering, Accounting or Technology.

Awarded to female students who have an interest in math or science while maintaining a strong academic record.

Awarded to an incoming SMCC freshman and to a graduating senior attending a Catholic college or university that teaches theology with the Mandatum of the Catholic Church.

Given to graduating seniors who demonstrate academic achievement while being involved in extracurricular activities.

Awarded to an incoming SMCC freshman who has a strong academic record and is involved in his or her parish and community.

### \$1,715,211 General Endowment Fund

The Endowment Fund is a general unrestricted fund used to provide money for the operation of Sandusky Central Catholic School for purposes deemed appropriate by the administration.

### \$1,576,458 Tuition Assistance

Established by Dr. James & Michele Gallagher and Dr. Susan Gallagher to financially support families who would like their children to attend SCCS. This fund now includes general tuition assistance gifts.

Established through consolidated memorials and donations to provide tuition assistance at SCCS for Holy Angels parishioner families.

Established by her son Kenneth Yontz and daughter Barb Pack in honor and memory of Dorothy Yontz who attended Holy Angels School. This fund provides tuition assistance at SCCS for Holy Angels parishioner families.

A donor advised fund, where monies are distributed annually for tuition assistance.

Established by St. Mary High School alum Ken Yontz to provide general SCCS tuition assistance.

\$73,855 Sister Mary Jon Wagner Tuition Assistance Established in honor of Sandusky Central Catholic School's first Superintendent upon her retirement. It is used to provide general SCCS tuition assistance.

### Established in memory of John Sortino, who died while a student at Sts. Peter and Paul School. It is awarded to a student who is active in his or her parish and school, and will attend SMCC for 9th grade.

The Beverly Vaith Fund, established in 2013, is a scholarship given to an SMCC student that demonstrates Catholic principles in their everyday life. The establishment of this Trust was very important to Mrs. Vaith in order to fulfill and continue her most heartfelt contributions to her favorite charities.

\$33,272 Mary Lay Post Graduate Fund The Mary Lay Scholarship is a renewable scholarship awarded to a graduating senior who demonstrates initiative and self-reliance, while maintaining an

### above average GPA. \$25,080 Cleveland Fund

The Mariorie A. Cleveland Endowed Scholarship was established in 2013. Mrs. Cleveland was a 1939 graduate of SMCC. This scholarship will be awarded to a high school student that demonstrates academic excellence.

\$12,807 The McKenna/ Platte Scholarship Fund Established by Walter Platte in honor of Fran McKenna & Dennis Platte. This scholarship represents their commitment to the Sts. Peter and Paul Athletics Program and their strong Catholic faith. It is awarded to an incoming SMCC freshman who is a Sts. Peter and Paul parishioner and is involved in school athletics.

#### \$12.617 Dennis Platte Scholarship Fund

Established by Dennis's wife, Emily, and is in honor of his commitment to the Sts. Peter and Paul Athletics Program and his deep Catholic faith. It is awarded to an incoming SMCC freshman who is a Sts. Peter and Paul parishioner and is involved in school athletics.

#### \$3,006 Post Graduate Fund

The Post Graduate Fund represents the Jacob Cullen scholarship, awarded to a graduating senior that exemplifies the meaning of Catholic identity. This scholarship was established by Jacob's grandfather, Mr. A. Vincent Agnew, in honor of Jacob receiving the 2005 Bishop's Cross award at his SMCC graduation.

### \$64,395 Library/Technology Fund

The Gallagher Library/Technology Fund, was originally established by Dr. James and Michele Gallagher to offset library expenses incurred at SCCS. In 2014, the donors agreed to use these funds for technology purposes.

### ANNUAL APPEAL

An unrestricted source of income that gives the school the opportunity to allocate funds where the need is greatest. An Annual Fund gift allows the school the most flexibility.

#### TUITION ASSISTANCE FUND

Over \$200,000 is distributed to our Panther families each year with close to 73% of students requiring some level of financial support to afford a Catholic education.

#### INVESTING IN EDUCATORS

This fund was established to help close the gap between our Catholic school and public school elementary teacher salaries.



### GENERAL ENDOWMENT FUND

Unrestricted gifts of any denomination. Annual allocations to SCCS support the immediate needs of our school.

#### SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

Endowed Scholarship: A minimum of \$25,000 is required. SMCC Scholarship: Gifts of any sized designated towards scholarships for SMCC high school students.

#### ENDOWED CHAIR FUND

The distribution of these funds is allocated towards high school teacher salaries, professional development, and departmental improvements.

### **TUITION ASSISTANCE FUND**
