A PEEK INTO THE CLASSROOM:

From Mr. Evans: In The Beginning... so has the school year begun for the Third Grade. We have been listening to the stories of the Hebrew Scriptures. We began by hearing the stories of the seven days of creation and, through painting, have experienced the mood, color and form of each of the days. In our stories so far, Adam and Eve have had their time in the Heavenly Garden and are now living on Earth and must earn their bread "by the sweat of their brow." And so too have the third graders' brows been sweating each week at our Gardens of Nutrition plot in New Paltz. They have tamed our garden plot, gathered rich soil and planted our fall crop of lettuce. Let's hope the woodchuck who lives in our plot doesn't notice it. Soon we will begin our weekly visits to Four Winds Farm. Through direct hands-on experience, the children will assist in many of the chores involved with running a farm. Professional farmers will guide the children during each visit and give valuable lessons along the way. Math lessons continue as well. We engaged in an intensive review of Second Grade math concepts, which will help us greatly with our Measurement block in October. During this block, the children will learn and gain facility with time and length measurement.

From Mr. Aram: The Seventh Grade started the year with a study of the way we see the world. Perspective drawing is an important part of the curriculum for the seventh grade. We practiced drawing objects in isometric perspective, plan and elevation. These are the architects' and builders' way. Then we focused on one and two point perspective drawings. These subjective perspectives were discovered and perfected by Renaissance artists. The study of Renaissance will be our next main lesson block.


