PLAY THERAPY AND TRACK A – THE FAST TRACK TO BECOMING AN RPT!

WHAT IS PLAY THERAPY?

Play is described as the child's world of "make-believe, and play therapy is "a safe place to work through inner conflicts, where toys are used as tools". For the therapist, it is one of the best places to learn about the child's inner thoughts, personality, worries and wishes (Irwin). Giants in the field such as Virginia Axline, Clark Moustakas, Carl Rogers and Haim Ginon have contributed much to the early development of play therapy. Garry Landreth and Louise Guerney later also made significant contributions. Play therapy is a specialized field in which the trained therapist creates an environment where the child uses play to heal.

WHY BECOME A REGISTERED PLAY THERAPIST?

Mental health services for children ages 3-10 requires specialized training in play therapy. Play therapy is a skill that is not heavily taught in graduate school. Our play therapy institute provides 150 hours of intensive training in play therapy and child psychotherapy to provide the expertise needed to bring about healing to children who present with trauma, behavioral issues, emotional dysregulation, anger, rage, grief and loss, and many other symptoms. Play therapy is no longer a well-kept secret the way it was when we first began the institute in 1997. With extensive research through the efforts of the Association for Play Therapy, this practice is shown to be evidenced-based.

HOW TO BECOME A REGISTERED PLAY THERAPIST:

This is a credentialing process through the Association for Play Therapy (APT), a nationwide organization located in California. After completing 150 hours of training and clinical supervision in play therapy, an application is submitted to the APT. Please contact the APT to determine how many supervision hours needed. CBPS provides over 150 hours of training. Our APT approved provider number is 97-034. You must be a licensed mental health provider and meet other requirements specified by the APT. Content of training includes history, theory, techniques/methods, and the application of play therapy to special populations and in special settings as recommended by APT. CBPS offers the recommended balance of 150 of play therapy training for one low cost with our Track A program. Your credentials would be RPT (Registered Play Therapist). In addition to 150 hours of training, 35-50 hours of play therapy supervision is required, contact APT website for full details. You may also become an RPT-S (Registered Play Therapist-Supervisor). WHAT IS TRACK A?

Anyone may register for ALL or any training. Track A is for individuals who are pursing credentials as a Registered Play Therapist and would like to pay a discounted fee for the 150 hours of Play Therapy training. If you are pursuing credentials, we suggest you take the training in the order presented. Training workshops begin with basic play therapy information and progress to more complex topics. Training is offered one or two weekends per month. If a participant registers for a training and does not attend without prior notification of cancellation (10 days or more prior to the event) they will be charged a \$25 fee for the handout. The 150 Hours of training must be completed within 2 years. See Track A application and schedule (on pages 8 - 14) for more information.

COST

The cost for most individual workshops is \$125.00-\$150.00 per day. Two days is \$300.00-\$318.00. Some workshops have special fees. Cost includes CE certificate unless otherwise noted. Cost for Track A is \$2500.00, which represents a **\$925 savings.** This cost includes 150 hours of training and 150 CE/Clock Hours approved thru the APT and does not include cost for clinical supervision. You may pay the entire fee or use our payment plan. Please add an additional \$125.00 if you need to use our payment plan. We accept credit card payments, checks, and PayPal payments. Please make checks payable to CBPS.

For those in Track A, payment is in full or a \$625.00 initial payment with completed application. The cost for returned checks and late payments is \$25.00 each.

Please consult your employer regarding funding. Several past participants have been successful in obtaining funding from employers. If you are active in a religious organization, consult your clergy. You may be able to offer FREE clinical services in exchange for funding. Another creative way is to sponsor a workshop and invite other agencies to participate. Grant funding may also be pursued.

HOW TO REGISTER FOR TRACK A

Complete the application form on our website and send to us via mail, email, or fax with payment. If participating in a payment plan the initial \$553 payment must accompany or precede the application.
