Lord, we recognize that Brett will not be ours alone. We thank you for Carol and Graham and Caleb, and we are grateful for their willingness to share Brett with us. Please be with the Youngers as we welcome them into our boisterous family.

Father God, on this historic morning we remember your commandment to respect our elders — and we thank you for blessing us with elders who are so easy to respect and to love. We would not be here without the most seasoned among us. We thank you for Plymouth's oldest members.
