



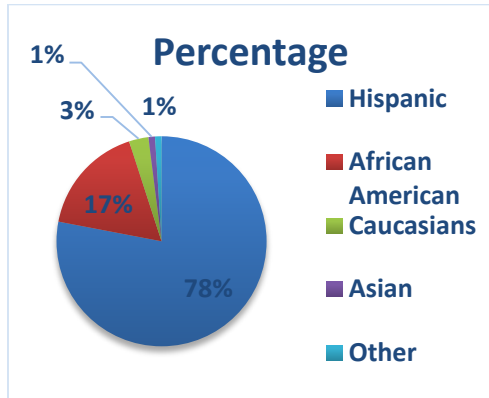
Meeting Needs. Transforming Lives

Our mission is to connect people in need with health, social and educational resources that can improve their lives.

How many did we help? 23,079 client visits. Clients sometimes came to ECHOS more than one time in 2016 (these numbers do not include food fair clients)

How many households were served during weekdays at ECHOS? 5,034 unduplicated households (does not include Saturday Food Fairs)

Who are ECHOS' clients? the underserved, the working poor, the unemployed, the "new poor"



- **18% increase** in the number of services provided over 2015
- **13,049** clients received food at the ECHOS Food Fair
- **3,647 children** served (unduplicated)
- **\$1,126** average household income for clients served
- Valued at **\$733,986.73** in-kind food donations distributed
- **13 tons of food** donated through the red barrel program.
- ECHOS expanded its hours and is now open on Fridays

What services did ECHOS provide?

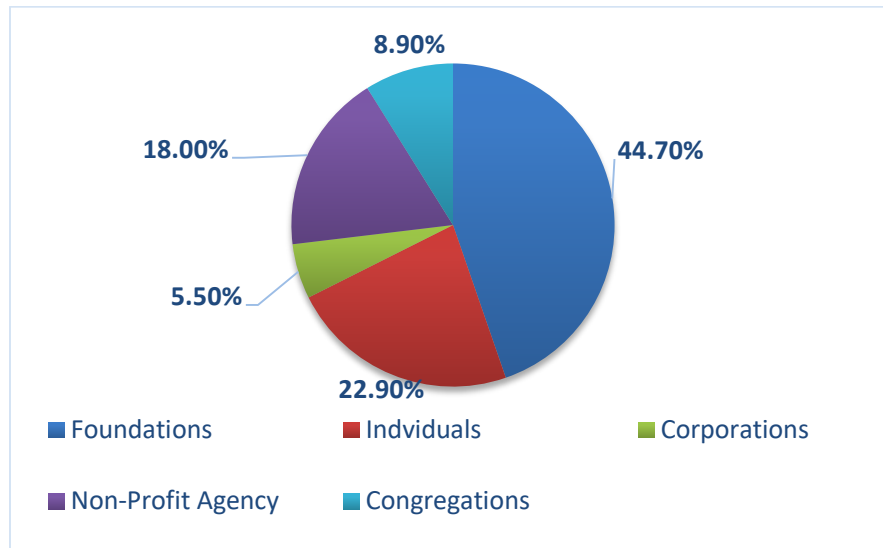
On-site services:

- Children's immunizations on the Texas Children's SuperKids mobile van
- Immigration and Referral program
- Vision screenings with referral to the University of Houston School of Optometry
 - University of Houston Mobile Van Unit sees clients on premises
- Medical Screening and referrals for:
 - Mammograms
- Blood pressure and blood glucose screenings and treatment referrals
- Dental services (preventive care screenings and education) on the University of Texas School of Dentistry's mobile dental van
- Food Pantry Services
- ESL (English as a Second Language) classes
- Computer Literacy Classes
- Monthly Food and Mini-Health Fairs
- School supplies and toys
- Domestic Violence Support Groups and Legal Services for Clients

On-site help in completing and submitting applications for medical and social services:

- Harris Health System (formerly Hospital District) **Financial Assistance Program** – so the uninsured can receive medical services at a primary care clinic rather than the emergency room
- Children's Medicaid/CHIP programs – that provide full service medical care for children whose parents are unemployed or unable to get or afford medical insurance where they work
- Medicaid/CHIP Perinatal programs – so women receive prenatal care and deliver full-term, healthy babies
- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) – Provides healthy food for families who rely on food pantries as a supplemental source of food
