Lois Locey has extensive first-hand experience cultivating stewardship and evangelization around the world from both a parish and diocesan perspective. She is best known for her creative ideas on stewardship, balancing the “theoretical” with the “practical.” She currently serves as the pastoral associate for administration and stewardship at St. Mary Magdalen Parish in Altamonte Springs, Florida, where she is responsible for developing a holistic vision of year-round stewardship. The three parishes where Lois ministered over a period of 23, each received the International Catholic Stewardship Council (ICSC) award for having the most outstanding total stewardship effort and materials. She served on the teaching faculty at the ICSC’s inaugural stewardship institute in Australia, where she worked with over 17 dioceses and their parishes to establish stewardship as a way of life in the land down under. Lois co-authored the ICSC’s *Children’s Stewardship Manual* and served as general editor/researcher for the ICSC’s book on best practices in Catholic stewardship throughout the world, *Keeping Stewardship Alive: Proven Stewardship Ideas*. Lois participated on the curriculum committee for the Catholic Leadership

Institute’s (CLI) “Tending the Talents” program and on a special task force to design CLI’s “Disciple-Maker Index.” Specializing in pastoral leadership, Church growth and engagement, Lois holds a Doctor of Ministry degree from Catholic University of America.
