### **NC WILDLIFE RESOURCES COMMISSION PUBLIC HEARING**

The NC Wildlife Resources Commission will hold a public hearing at Craven Community College in New Bern. On Wed., Jan. 25, at 7 pm.

There will be multiple issues addressed according to the Public Hearings handbook including the following rule change for striped bass. (Excerpt from Handbook noted below)

Striped Bass and Bodie Bass (Hybrid Striped Bass) para. F11.

Modify the exception to the general statewide regulation for Striped Bass in inland fishing waters of the Neuse, Pungo and Tar-Pamlico rivers by increasing the minimum size limit of 18 inches to 26 inches. The daily creel limit (2 per day) and harvest season (October 1–April 30) will not change.

Justification: Annual assessments by NCWRC biologists of Striped Bass population characteristics in the Neuse and Tar rivers continue to document high mortality, truncated size and age structures, and minimal natural recruitment. The proposed change is intended to promote the abundance of larger, older female Striped Bass, which is expected to result in increased egg production.
