SB743 Vehicle Miles Traveled

Primary Metric

Senate Bill (SB) 743 was signed in 2013, requiring a move away from vehicle delay and level of service (LOS) to transportation analysis pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). It also requires the Governor's Office of Planning and Research (OPR) to identify new metrics for identifying and mitigating transportation impacts. OPR identified Vehicle Miles Traveled (VMT) per capita and VMT per employee as the new metrics for transportation analysis.
