


DIGITAL SIGNATURES WHAT - WHY - HOW?

Section 668 of the Florida Statutes defines a digital signature as a type of electronic signature that transforms a message using an asymmetric cryptosystem such that a person having the initial message and the signatures public key can accurately determine:


- a) whether the transformation was created using the private key that corresponds to the public key
- b) whether the initial message has been altered since the transformation was made

What exactly does that mean?

Signed By



- A digital signature is the digital equivalent of a handwritten signature or stamped seal.
- Digital signatures have the same legal significance as traditionally wet-ink signatures.
- Digital signatures support the Department's e-Construction effort to conduct business in a paperless environment.

The Department requires each certificate:

- National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) assurance level of three (3) or higher
- Issued from a Department approved digital Certificate Authority.


WHAT IS AN ELECTRONIC SIGNATURE?


Section 668 of the Florida Statutes defines an electronic signature as any letters, characters, or symbols, manifested by electronic or similar means, executed or adopted by a party with an intent to authenticate a writing.

All construction projects let July 2016 will be required to conduct business with the Department within a paperless environment. In order to do so, all stakeholders whom have signatory duties on projects, will be required to have a Digital Signature.

IdenTrust has been chosen by the Department as its primary Digital certificate provider but we do not mandate its use by our stakeholders, as long as Department policies are complied with. Please refer to the list of acceptable Digital Certificate Providers.

Exporting a Digital Certificate

- Steps are included in the <u>Simple</u>
 <u>Digital Signature Instructions</u> on the State Construction Website.
- Why should I export my digital certificate?
 - To use it on other devices (computer, tablet, phone, etc.)
 - To have a back up in case your computer crashes or gets updated

The Department recommends the use of the free Adobe Reader to digitally sign documents and forms on Department contracts.



Installing and Configuring Adobe

- Steps are included in the <u>Simple</u> <u>Digital Signature Instructions</u> on the State Construction Website.
- What do I need to configure?
 - Adobe Settings (certificate store, etc.)
 - Your digital signature appearance
 - This is what your signature will look like when you apply it to a document (it may include your name, the date the document was signed, a picture of your signature, company logo or PE seal, position title, etc.)

Creating a PDF Document from an Excel File

- Steps are included in the <u>Simple</u> <u>Digital Signature Instructions</u> on the State Construction Website.
- Why would I want to create a PDF from Excel?
 - To remove the excel functions and properties from your document
 - To change the file type to PDF
- You can create a PDF from many different programs by printing to PDF instead of a typical printer

Signing a PDF Document

- 2 ways to sign a PDF Document
 - Many Construction forms have been updated to include signature boxes. For these, just click and sign.
 - For Construction forms that don't have a signature box, you can easily create one in Adobe, then click and sign.
 - Steps are included in the <u>Simple Digital</u> <u>Signature Instructions</u> on the State Construction Website.

Validating a Signature

- Steps are included in the <u>Simple</u> <u>Digital Signature Instructions</u> on the State Construction Website.
- Why do I need to validate signatures?
 - To ensure the signature is from an approved signature authority
 - To ensure the signature was valid when the document was signed
 - To ensure the document was not altered

Digital Signature FAQ



In an effort to eliminate redundant questions concerning digital signatures, the State Construction Office will answer questions that arise, in order to provide general guidance for FDOT staff and stakeholders.

At this time, it is recommended to digitally sign all documents with the free **Adobe Acrobat Reader DC** or Adobe Acrobat DC to avoid invalidating digital signatures.

Why is only Adobe Acrobat recommended for digitally signing documents and forms?

When a document is signed by someone in Bluebeam and subsequently in Adobe, it invalidates both signatures. When a document is signed by someone in Adobe and subsequently in Bluebeam, it invalidates both signatures. When a document is signed by someone in Bluebeam and subsequently in Bluebeam, it invalidates both signatures.

What can I do to fix this, so both signatures are valid?

The website only allows specific providers and I was wondering if there was a reason Adobe Acrobat signatures were not included on the list?


Why does the digital signature status show up as UNKNOWN?
