

Determining the Color of Your Porsche

Because Porsche changes even basic colors slightly from year to year, each variation has a unique name. For example, you may think your car is silver, but is it GT Silver, Silver Metallic, Zinc Metallic, Zermatt Silver Metallic, Rhodium Silver, etc.

The best way to determine the color name for your Porsche is to determine the paint code. The code is typically on a sticker, but the location of the sticker varies; [click here for help finding the sticker](#). Once you have the code, you can Google “Porsche paint code ____” and likely learn the color’s name.

If you don’t have the code, you might try the following:

 - When you get to your model, be sure to look under “Exterior” and click on the “Color Chart” to see sample colors and names
