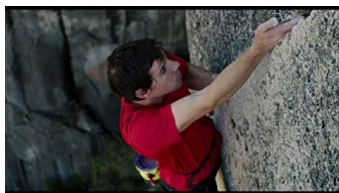

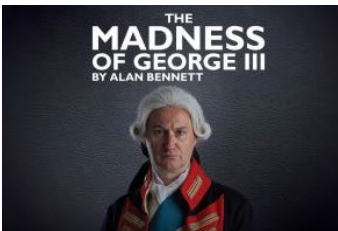
The Met Live in HD: Muhly's Marnie (2 hours, 52 minutes with a 30-minute intermission)
