



## **Hay Situation and Price Update for March/April**

During the month of February producers are reporting limited movement of hay within the province and some movement of good quality hay south due in part to the lower Cdn \$. Hay supplies continue to be adequate through most of the province. As we move into spring, depending on conditions, there may be some upside on the hay market.

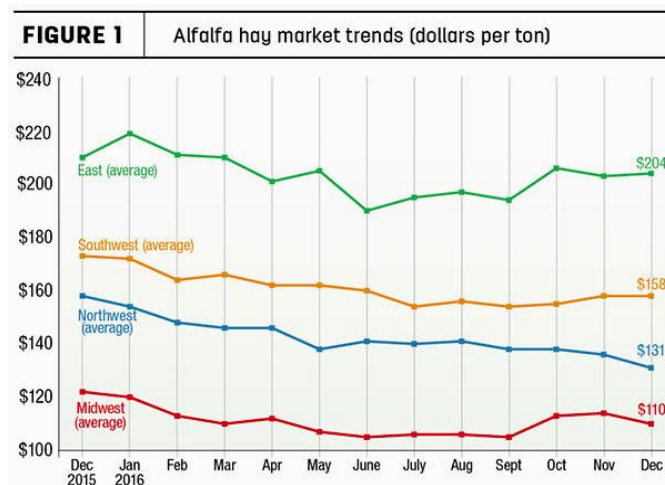
### **Hay Prices**

Hay prices seem to be flat, however there is some movement of local hay. Supplies of beef quality hay are still adequate to surplus and dairy quality supplies seem to be limited with limited sales. Straw supplies are limited but prices continue to hold.

Alfalfa:	4-7 cents/lb
	Dairy Quality 6-8 cents/lb
Alfalfa/Grass:	Good Quality 5-7cents/lb
	Beef Quality 2.5-4 cents/lb
Beef Hay (grass):	2.5-5 cents/lb
Horse Hay:	5-7 cents/lb
Straw:	<1-2.2 cents/lb

Hay prices to the south have remained low and steady. Buyer interest picked up in early February, suggesting the marketing year has begun to thaw, with price increases in the prime hay and beef quality hay.

## Hay Quality

This year we have been reporting there are some concerns about the quality of the 2016 forage crop. Producers have been encouraged to have their feed tested to ensure the nutritional needs of their livestock are being met. The chart below provides an indication as to the quality of Manitoba's forage. This information was provided by Landmark Feeds and is a summary of the forages that they tested this year. One word of caution, most of the forages sampled are from Dairy operations.
