



Department of Speech-Language Pathology – Tenure Track, Open Rank Faculty Position

Sacred Heart University, in Fairfield, Connecticut, is the second-largest Catholic university in New England. The College of Health Professions at Sacred Heart University invites applications for the position of full time, tenure-track, open rank Professor available August 2018 in the Department of Speech-Language Pathology. In the new Center for Healthcare Education, the individual in this position will have responsibility for teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in communication disorders. Additional responsibilities will include clinical supervision, course and curriculum development, student recruitment and advisement, program evaluation, and University service and scholarship. The credit load for the position is 24 credits distributed over 10 months and the faculty member will report to the Chair of the Department of Speech-Language Pathology.

Requirements:

- Earned Doctorate (ABD considered) in Communication Disorders (Speech-Language Pathology or Audiology), or related field.
- Ability to teach both undergraduate and graduate courses in Communication Disorders.
- Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology.

Preferred qualifications:

- Ability/interest in teaching areas involving Adult Neurogenic Communication Disorders, Cognitive-Communication Disorders, and Motor-Speech Disorders.
- The ability/interest to teach undergraduate courses in the areas of child speech and language development and disorders, anatomy and physiology of speech, hearing, and swallowing, neuroanatomy and physiology, clinical methods.
- Eligibility for a Connecticut Department of Health License in SLP.
- Interest/experience in clinical supervision of graduate students.

Sacred Heart University's developing program in SLP is accredited by the Connecticut Office of Higher Education and has achieved Candidacy from Council on Academic Accreditation (CAA) in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology of the American Speech, Language and Hearing Association (ASHA), 2200 Research Boulevard, #310, Rockville, MD 20850, 800 498 2071 or 301 296 5700. Candidacy is a "preaccreditation" status with the CAA, awarded to developing or emerging programs for maximum period of 5 years. Our program employs innovative teaching techniques including problem-based learning, inverse teaching, simulation, and service learning. Our field-based clinical program will involve externships throughout the students' education. Our salaries are highly competitive. Intensive mentorship for both research and teaching are available with the Program Director. Diversity is valued and sought after within our program, College, and University.
