Creating Art for a Cause

What is it?

This is a chance to create something to help support victims of human trafficking. High School students and faculty will have the opportunity to create and donate an original work of art inspired by the theme/idea of “Hope.”

This fundraising project is a response to the Human Trafficking Awareness Chapels presented by the Class of 2019. It is a way for our community to reflect on and react to the suffering of our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Proceeds from this project will be donated to Freedom House, a Bay Area non-profit organization with a mission to bring hope, restoration, and a new life to survivors of human trafficking by providing a safe home and long-term aftercare.

Who can participate?

High school students, faculty, and staff members are encouraged to participate. No professional artistic talent required. Just be courageous, creative, and thoughtful as you create your piece of art.

Winning the “Art War”

All works of art will be displayed the week of May 1 – May 5. Students and community members will be able to vote for the work(s) of art they feel best embodies the idea of “Hope” by making a monetary donation.

The student and faculty art pieces collecting the largest contributions will be declared the winners of Art War. Photos of the winning art pieces and artists will be published in the May 12 edition of Life on the Hill.

Silent Auction of All Art Pieces

All works submitted will be sold via a silent auction. Bidding begins on May 1 and concludes after the Spring Cabaret on Friday, May 5. Winners of the art pieces can pay and pick up their pieces after the show on Friday, May 5 or the week of May 8 – 12 in the high school front office.

How can I participate? (Rules)

All original art pieces must be submitted to the high school front office by Tuesday, April 25 at 9:00 am. The artwork can be of a variety of medium: a painting, line drawing, jewelry, poem, 3-D project, photography, or something else. Each work submitted must have a title and be labeled with the artist’s name on the back.

Size constraints:

Wall hangings for this project can be no more than 3ft x 3ft. and weigh no more than 5lbs. 3-D sculptures can be no bigger than 1.5 ft. x 1.5 ft. x 1.5 ft.

Reminder: Your artwork will be a DONATION, meaning it will be displayed and then be sold as a part of silent auction happening at the High School Visual Art Gallery on May 5.
