Celebrating A Broadway Tradition and Looking Forward

Coming Together As Family This Sunday!

Sunday, June 11, is one of those rare Sunday mornings when the Broadway family will come together for one worship service at 10:30 a.m. Why? Because June 11 is also our traditional Chicken Dinner and Annual Meeting, when we come together for a delicious lunch and celebrate another year of ministry together!

Our worship will be held in the Christian Life Center (CLC) and begin at 10:30 a.m. Combining our services into one allows all of our talented musicians and vocalists to be a part of worship, from Chancel Choir and bells to the Ensemble to John Rawlings from our Daybreak worship. Remember that there will be no Christian Education classes on June 11; however, All God's Children will have its regular class time during worship.

Following the service, the crowd will move to the buffet lines in the Fellowship Hall for some delicious Lee's Chicken and sample the potluck extravaganza! Connections Ministry will coordinate the meal and will provide green beans and rolls to go along with the dinner. Cost for the meal is \$5 per person, with a family maximum of \$20. Any leftover chicken may be purchased following the meal. Members and friends are asked to bring a dish to share: last names beginning A-G, bring a side dish; H-M, bring a salad; and N-Z, bring a dessert.



As soon as everyone has finished visiting the buffet line and is seated, the Annual Meeting will begin. Staff members who are celebrating an anniversary will be recognized and our outgoing Board members will also be thanked for their service to the church. The congregation will be also be asked to affirm the 2017-2018

church operating budget, which was approved by the Board at its May 30 meeting.

During the business portion of our gathering, families are welcome to send their children outside, just to the east of the CLC, for our second Field Day event! There will be plenty of supervision outside to watch over the kids as they make crafts, swoop down the giant slide and play some old-fashioned games, like sack races.

Hope to see you this Sunday at 10:30 a.m.!

Highlights from the May 30 Board Meeting

The Church Board met on Tuesday, May 30, 2017. Chair Leslie Clay called the meeting to order at 7:02 p.m.

Information Items

Financial Review/Audit Report: Nancy Welty, Broadway's Financial Secretary, conducted a review of the church's pledged giving and found no issues to report. She was very complimentary of Church Administrator Ingrid Luckenbill's record-keeping and attention to detail.

Ministry Area Reports: These reports were submitted and attached to the Board packet. These reports are available from the church office or for download in the *Broadway Weekly* e-news.

Financial Report: Treasurer Martha Head reported that all ministry areas were on track. Quarterly Service Ministry allocations had been distributed.

Action Items

Church Bus Driver: Phil Fichter was approved as an additional bus driver.

Deacon Chair Replacement: Todd Rauch was nominated and approved to serve as Deacon Chair to replace Susie Kempf, who will serve as Board Vice-

Chair beginning July 1.

Children & Young Adults Ministry Vacation Bible School Sponsors: A request from Children's Ministries to allow the solicitation of sponsors for special VBS programming for 3-5 graders. The motion to allow sponsorship was approved.


Permanent Funds Distribution: A request from Worship & Liturgical Arts to purchase new cases for hand bells at a cost of \$2675 was approved.

2017-2018 Operating Budget: Pledge units for '17-'18 are on track with previous year's pledge units, with 77 families/individuals increasing pledged amounts. As of May 30, the church received 227 pledges for a total of \$707,381. The Executive Committee recommended the adoption of the Comprehensive Budget plan, which includes a 5% Personnel Package increase, along with increases for ministry areas. Vice-Chair John Poehlmann made a motion to adopt the Comprehensive Plan; seconded by Elder Chair Tina Windett. After discussion and the recounting of the CLC capital campaign by Tina Windett, the Board approved the Comprehensive Budget plan.

Following Minister's remarks, the meeting was closed with a prayer from Terry Overfelt.

Enough of the sad stuff! The Broadway staff is celebrating the arrival of two new staff members! Taby Lane, who will serve as Youth Ministry Coordinator and assume a portion of the tech responsibilities on Sunday morning, joined the staff on June 1. Trevor Hatfield will serve as our Summer Ministry Intern, and began his duties on June 5.

Broadway's youth in grades 6-12 are already familiar with Taby and her gifts. She began volunteering on Wednesday evenings after the first of the year. She will be present on Sunday mornings in the Loft during the Christian Education hour, be a part of the Youth Mission Trip to Steubenville and be an integral part of all fall youth events and planning.

In addition to working with our youth, Taby will be responsible for our projection tech for all worship services. This will include rehearsing with the Ensemble on Thursday evenings, loading images and texts for projections as well as overseeing and training volunteers for Sunday morning tech duties.

Taby spent much of the last fifteen years in

southwest Missouri, graduating from Southwest Baptist University in Bolivar with a degree in Church Administration. After graduation, she was a Residential Director at SWBU, overseeing residence halls and working with individual students and student groups. Her father's health scare brought Taby back to Columbia—and to Broadway. She became a member in November, 2016.
