Training

- Attend the two-day training event to learn, apply and practice good coaching skills.

- Upon completion, you are a Level I coach in the ELCA.

Practice

- Use new skills by coaching two people for at least six sessions over six months.
- Work with a coach as you are developing your own coaching skills.

Labs

- Consider participating in a coaching lab to further develop your skills and a coaching specialty.
- Labs include: Stewardship and Discipleship.
- Labs under development: Mission Development and Mission Redevelopment.
- Upon completion, you are a Level II coach in the ELCA.
