Germany Today 2017: Application Deadline: March 17th

DAAD North America is once again inviting senior administrators from universities, research institutions and funding agencies to apply to take part in this year's Germany Today information tour.

This year's tour will take place from June 18-24, 2017 under the heading *Promoting Research and Cooperation in the University Scene: Germany's Excellence Strategy and Cluster Policy*. This year's itinerary includes stops at institutions in Bonn, Cologne, Bochum, Dortmund and Hamburg where participants will be introduced to the underlying concept behind these funding initiatives, consider the results to date along with the challenges and pitfalls which accompany this approach.

DAAD is able to cover participants' program-related costs while they are in Germany (accommodation, domestic travel and most meals). Applications to participate will be accepted until **March 17, 2017**.

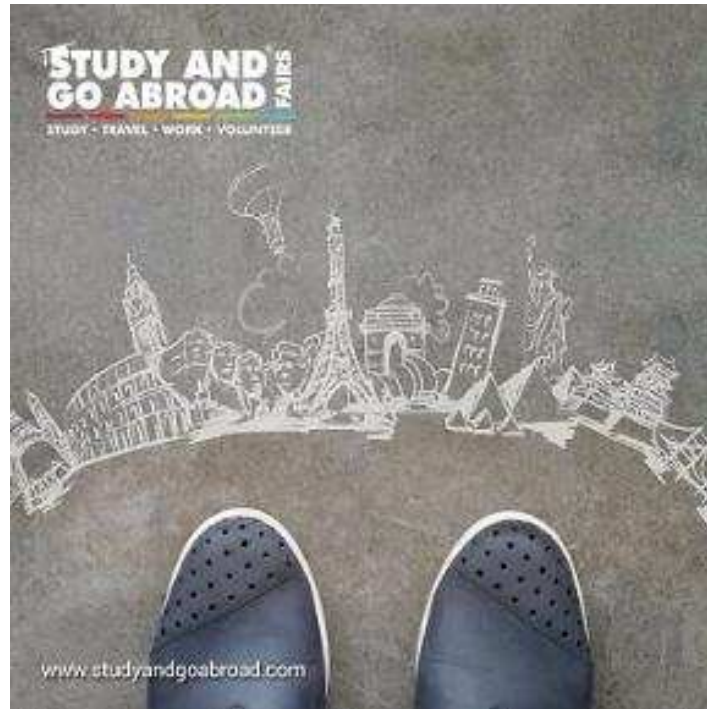

Upcoming DAAD Deadlines

We would like to take this opportunity to provide an early reminder that deadlines for a number of DAAD programs are approaching in May. These include:

Research Grant - Short Stay: This program supports **PhD students** and **Postdocs** interested in carrying out a research stay in Germany of between 1 and 6 months in length. Deadline: May 15th. More details at: www.daad-canada.ca/research-grants

Research Stays: This grant is open to **full-time faculty** at Canadian universities wishing to carry out a research stay in Germany of between 1 and 3 months in length. Deadline: May 15th. More details at: www.daad-canada.ca/research-stays.



The **German Studies Research Grant** provides a generous stipend for a 1-2 month research stay to **students at all levels of study** who wish to travel to Germany to carry out a research project. Students must be nominated by their Program Chair or Supervisor and the terms of the award vary by level of study. Deadline: May 1st. For more information, visit: www.daad-canada.ca/find-funding.

Postdoctoral Researchers International Mobility Experience (P.R.I.M.E.): This program supports the international mobility of **postdoctoral researchers** via temporary positions at German universities in place of conventional scholarships. Postdoctoral researchers of all nationalities, who see their long-term career perspectives in Germany, will be given the opportunity to combine employment at a German university with a research stay abroad. Planning to Study in Germany? Start Learning the Language Ahead of Time

Anyone interested in doing a German-language degree program in Germany needs an adequate knowledge of German. Admission to such programs requires proof of German language skills, something applicants can demonstrate by completing either the DSH or TestDaf language test. While the DSH exam can be taken only in Germany, the TestDaf exam is offered by the Goethe-Institut Toronto, the cultural institute of the Federal Republic of Germany with a global reach. The Goethe-Institut Toronto offers not only proficiency exams, but it is also a four-time winner of NOW Magazine's award for "Best Language School".

Here we would like to present two young people who either studied or will study in Germany and shared their experience of learning German at the Goethe-Institut:

"I fell in love with the country and language of Germany in high school and decided to study German in university. I thought that the best way to learn the language was to be immersed in it, so I wanted to apply to universities in Germany itself. All the programs I was interested in required knowledge of German at the C1 level, so I took a course with the Goethe-Institut in preparation. I chose the Goethe-Institut not only because it is known for the quality of its language teaching, but also because it offers courses at higher language levels, which are often not available elsewhere.

I passed my C1 exam in 2011 and graduated from the University of Munich in 2015 with a Bachelor's degree in teaching German as a foreign language. Upon graduation, I got a job at the Goethe-Institut myself, where I now work." - Imogen Jenkins

"I want to study in Germany as a musician, cellist to be specific. I also have had an interest in German culture, and learning the language is the first step to appreciating a culture.

I would like to achieve a Bachelor in Orchestral Instruments/Instrumental Performance. I am going to apply to Düsseldorf, Essen, Würzburg, Berlin and Freiburg. Level B1 of German is required for the audition, and a B2 must be achieved by the end of the first semester.

The Goethe-Institut was recommended to me by many people for its immersive teaching approach and the excellence of its staff. When it came time to choose a language school, my parents and I chose the Goethe-Institut for these reasons.

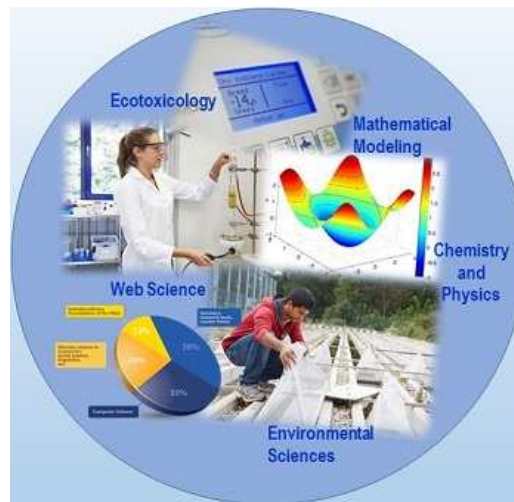
