Organ transplants save lives every day, but present many challenges for individuals, families, and communities. Eminent transplant surgeon Dr. Greenstein will lead a discussion on medical aspects of organ donation and transplants. Also joining in the discussion, Rabbi Bronstein (BAS), Rabbi Marder (HIWP), and Rabbi Tucker (TIC) will address matters of Jewish tradition and halakha. A Q&A will follow.

Coffee, tea and bagels will be served at noon; the presentation starts at 12:30pm.

Dr. Greenstein is a professor of surgery at Albert Einstein, transplant surgeon at Montefiore, and a longtime member of the Montefiore Bioethics Committee; he has performed nearly a thousand transplants over the past three decades and is one of only a handful of Orthodox Jewish transplant surgeons practicing in the United States today.
