Jewish Values through Children's Literature

Authors use books to convey deep truths about the world and their experience in it. In this elective we'll explore Middot (Jewish Values) as we read various children's books. Each week we will read a children's book and connect it to Jewish texts such as the Torah, Mishnah, and Midrashim. Through the classic tale of The Giving Tree by Shel Silverstein we will explore the middah of *Nedivut* (generosity) and examine what the Torah has to say about this Jewish Value. Other middot that will be explored include *Dibuk Haverim* (cleaving to friends), *Derekh Eretz* (common decency), *Gimilut Hasadim* (acts of loving kindness), *Lo Levayesh* (not embarrassing) and more.

Jews and Food: Mindful Eating for Body and Soul

Does what feeds your body also nurture your soul? This course is about Mindful Jewish Eating - Kashrut and Jewish Food Ethics; Ma'Akhal Re'Evim - the Jewish Response to Hunger; and Shemirat HaNefesh, Shemirat Ha'Goof - Taking Care of Ourselves through Food. We'll look at traditional and contemporary approaches to Kashrut, eco-kashrut, our responsibility towards the community regarding hunger, as well as our responsibilities to our bodies and ourselves. Throughout the course, learners will share a recipe from their family, and we will create a cookbook.

Join in the fun as we explore the role food plays in Judaism, and the role Judaism plays in food. We will cook "Jewishly" (and learn what that means), and explore Jewish values that pertain to cooking, such as cooking for the sick, feeding the homeless and much more. We will cook, we will eat, and we will share food with others.
