Assumption of risks & waiver of claims

In consideration of the benefits derived from participation as a Guest on this trip, the uncertainties and risks of the trip, the fact that the risks are outside the control of the Sponsor(s), and the non-profit, religious nature of the Sponsor(s), the undersigned hereby: 1) Accepts and assumes all risks and consequences of the risks associated with the trip, on behalf of the Participant, including, without limitation, any resulting illness, injury, death, pain and suffering, economic loss, loss of personal property, and any other loss or damage, at any time, now or in the future. 2) Releases, waives, and forever discharges any and all claims, causes of action, and liabilities against the Sponsor(s) related to the risks and any and all other injury, damage, or losses associated with the trip by the Participant, including any minor children or dependents, whether direct or indirect, whenever occurring now or in the future, including without limitation, any acts of negligence, lack of due care, and any decision on medical treatment or evacuation. 3) Agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Sponsor(s) from any and all present or future claims, demands or actions in law or inequity that may hereafter be made or brought, for damages or any other legal or equitable remedy or account of any injury, illness, physical condition, inconvenience, or loss that arises directly or indirectly from the Participant's trip, whether to Participant or Participant's spouse, or children, or other dependents. 4) Agrees that, notwithstanding the foregoing, if a legal action related to the trip is commenced by or on behalf of the Participant, the undersigned spouse, or any applicable minor or dependent against the Sponsor(s), such action will be brought in the County of St. Louis, State of Missouri, the United States of America, and that all legal issues in such action or proceeding, including the interpretation of this agreement, shall be governed by the laws and statutes of the State of Missouri.

Camp Wartburg is about 45 miles from Lambert St. Louis International Airport. A shuttle is available for \$15 each way from the airport to Camp Wartburg at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, October 20, and from the camp to the airport on Tuesday, October 24, leaving camp at 3:00 p.m. For more information about shuttle availability, please contact anne.gonzalez@lcms.org.

Registration is after lunch on Friday, October 20, from noon to 1:00 p.m. When you arrive at camp, please go directly to Lindenberg Village. There is limited parking; please register, unload your luggage, and then move your car to the parking area near the camp entrance.

Camp Wartburg does not provide bedding or towels. If you are not able to bring your own bedding, we can provide a sleeping bag and pillow for \$20.

All meals will be provided in the camp dining hall. We will walk to and from our lodging. Transportation will be provided for those who have difficulty walking.


