STAT Program

STAT (Stoughton Hospital Teen Activities Team) is a volunteer program designed for students ages 14 to 18 to engage them in healthcare while working with our patients in a supervised, supportive environment.

Next Session: April 2 to May 16, 2018 (eight weeks)

Commitment: Two hours per week

Application Deadline: March 19, 2018

As a STAT Program Volunteer, a student gains real life experience in a health care setting. The Volunteers are supervised by a recreational therapist and participate in activities to engage patients. Those activities may include visiting with patients, crafts, and games such as Wii, dice, bingo, and cards. Volunteers may also be asked to assist staff with serving snacks and meals.

Volunteers commit to volunteering for two hours a week for eight weeks. The recommended hours are 3:30 to 5:30 p.m. or 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Ten Volunteers are chosen through an interview process looking for individuals that are interested and enthusiastic about making a difference in the lives of our patients. It is an opportunity for students to become empowered with leadership and communication skills while being exposed to the hospital environment and community. Participation in the STAT Program may also help fulfill education requirements, build a resume for college, and learn new skills while helping others.

The STAT Program is offered four times a year in eight week sessions.

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Stoughton Rec. Ski Club

2017-2018

Introduction

The Stoughton Recreation Department Ski Club offers 6th –12th graders the opportunity to learn to ski or snowboard with their friends at group rates. Tubing is also available at Cascade. Note that a tubing ticket will not get you on the ski hill. For your child's safety, lessons are required on the first trip unless specifically waived on the membership form. Additional lesson are strongly suggested. This is a wonderful opportunity for winter recreation. Parents are encouraged to participate as chaperones and **if chosen**, will receive a free lift ticket and bus ride. Chaperones are contacted a week in advance. If space is available, additional adults can go at the group rate. Contact the Rec. Dept. if you want to buy a ticket and ride with your child. In order for the child to participate, parents must complete the attached membership form **only once**, for the **first** trip their child attends. Fees are listed for each trip. If your child is renting, an additional form will need to be completed for each rental. Parents are responsible for lost rentals, so discuss the need for securing skis, snow boards, and helmets when going inside to warm up. **Toy snowboards that do not have steel edges are not permitted on the hill.** You must rent if your board is not safe.

Sign-ups

The completion of a membership form is required once prior to the first trip. Payments must be made in advance of the scheduled trip. Make checks out to **Stoughton Rec. Dept.** You can also sign up by going to the Stoughton Rec. Dept. from 7:30 AM-4:30 PM, Mon. – Thursday (located in City Hall) or online at <https://apm.activecommunities.com/stoughtonrec/>. For information you can call 873-6746. We will not take signups after noon on Thursdays prior to the trip.

The Day of the Trip

Be sure your child has warm clothes including a hat, mittens or gloves, long underwear, and a good coat. Wool socks are much warmer than cotton. Try to avoid cotton socks. Weather conditions on the hill are much colder and the facility may be making snow near the chair lifts. Skies and boards should be brought to school by the parents, as bus drivers may not want them on the bus due to safety concerns. Equipment may be stored at school if arrangements can be made with the office. Send along something to eat while on the bus and at the hill. Food is available to purchase, but is

costly. It is advisable to rent a locker for storage of personal items such as shoes while you ski. Lockers can be rented for \$.50, so send along some change. Be sure to let your child know where you will be that evening in case we need to contact you about an injury. This information should also be listed on the membership form. **If your child is renting, do not forget to send the signed rental form along.**

Departures

Buses will depart from River Bluff Middle School and the high school front parking lots. Students should be ready to go 10 minutes before the scheduled departure, as buses will not wait. Skies can be loaded on the trailer that will accompany the bus. January 19 is an early release day. We will be going right after school that day to the ski hill.

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Return

Parents will need to make arrangements for their child to be picked. We will drop off all students at **River Bluff**. Please be there about 10 minutes before the anticipated return time, as there is no place for your child to stay warm, and the bus will not wait. Return times may be effected by weather. We will not rush if weather is poor.

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Behavior

Participation in the ski club is a privilege. If you abuse this, you will not be allowed to attend trips for the remainder of the season. Students will be automatically expelled from the group for bringing or consuming alcohol, drugs, or tobacco. Disrespectful or dangerous behavior will also end your season. Parents may be called to come and take you home.

Safety

The safety of your child is of our highest concern. It is for this reason we require the lessons unless you specifically waive them. There will be at least two adult chaperones on the bus. Student's behavior will determine their continued participation. All rules of the hill must be followed.

It is also important to ski safely. If you are warned more than once in a season by the ski patrol about unsafe skiing you will not be allowed to participate. Be sure to secure your personal items in a locker while skiing and lock your skies when you go inside. Parents are responsible for lost/stolen skis and snowboards.

If an injury occurs, each hill has trained rescue personnel to assist. You will be notified of an injury. If the injury is serious, an ambulance may be called and arrangements for transport to a local hospital. Providing complete medical information on the membership form is critical. Many skiers now use a helmet for added personal safety, this is recommended. Helmets can be rented and are sometimes free for use.

Cancellation

The ski club reserves the right to postpone or cancel a trip due to bad weather, extreme cold, lack of participation, or available supervision.

If school is cancelled or released early due to the weather, the trip will be postponed until the next week. That week's trip will be moved to the end of the season. There is no need to re-sign up for the trip that was postponed, although additional signups may be taken if space allows.

If you have signed up but are unable to attend, you must let the Stoughton Rec. Dept. know this by Thursday at noon or you will lose your bus money, \$16 (if there is a waiting list. Absence due to illness will be given until 8:00 AM on Friday to cancel or the bus money is forfeited. Call 873-6746 to cancel. Monies from a cancellation will be credited to your next trip.



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4-Year Old Kindergarten Enrollment and Registration Information

Greetings from the Stoughton Area School District!

This flyer is intended to provide important information on the TWO PART enrollment and registration process for families with children who **are or will turn four on or before September 1st, 2018**. They are eligible for our free, community based 4-Year Old Kindergarten program in the fall.



Part one: ENROLLMENT: Required for all students entering the district, even if siblings already attend, but can be completed on own after January 23rd, 2018. Student information is entered into infinite campus (data housing system) and officially places student on our district rosters. Process requires a computer and internet connection, may take up to 30 minutes to complete.

Part two: REGISTRATION: Required to complete the enrollment process. Guardian provides documentation, student birth certificate and proof of residency, to district staff. Site request forms are also collected on this scheduled date.

****Site request forms are no longer time stamped and site placement is NOT determined on a first come-first serve basis.*


