Hey there—

Did you know that on election day, November 6, 2018, Massachusetts will be the first state forced to defend transgender rights at the ballot box?

A ballot question will ask Massachusetts voters to repeal a 2016 law that protects transgender people from discrimination in public spaces. If the law is overturned at the ballot box, transgender people will once again face discrimination in places where any of us are when we're not at home, work or school – such as malls and restaurants, parks and government offices.

A "YES" vote will ensure that protections from discrimination remain in place for transgender people.

✓ Make Phone Calls

You can help educate voters about the ballot question by participating in a phone bank. When you phone bank, you'll be making phone calls to voters along with a team of other people. You'll be trained and provided with a script.

Phone banking can be virtual (i.e., you make calls from your own home) or in person (i.e., you go to a place where a group of people are making calls together).

✓ **Canvass**

Canvassing means going door-to-door, together with others, to talk with voters about the ballot question. When you canvass, you'll be provided with training, a script, and a list of names and addresses. You'll canvass in teams with other people who are committed to upholding trans rights in Massachusetts.
