Panim Hadashot-New Faces High Holiday Schedule for 2017

A Summary of Services and Special Programs

### **Introduction to High Holidays with Panim Hadashot-New Faces**

Panim Hadshot-New Faces will offer High Holiday services at the Seattle Jewish Community School in the Pinehurst neighborhood in North Seattle. We will offer the beautifully crafted music of our Heart of Shabbat Ensemble to share both traditional and new Hebrew melodies of the High Holidays. Our Rabbi intersperses services with Kavanot—short commentaries on the liturgy and themes of the Days of Awe—to deepen the spiritual impact and to explore the insights and difficulties of these ancient texts we chant at this time of year.

Our aim is to encourage community singing and participation that stimulates the mind and the heart. Services are led by Rabbi Dov Gartenberg and Ari Joshua, master musician and leader of the Heart of Shabbat Ensemble. We expect to attract a very diverse group and hope that our emphasis on Jewish hospitality will make it possible for every participant to meet new faces and to start new friendships.

Children and teenagers are most welcome at all of our services and programs. We plan to have child care for children under eight and an activity center for children over eight during the first day of Rosh Hashannah, Kol Nidre, and Yom Kippur morning. We will take advantage of being in a school environment which has great resources for children's activities. Since we are at a school, there are playground facilities available. We will organize adult volunteers for playground supervision.



### **Rosh Hashannah Services and Special Programs**

Our Rosh Hashannah services serve to prepare and immerse us in the ways of repentance, change, and reconciliation. To accomplish this, we have varied our Rosh Hashannah offerings. The Erev Rosh Hashannah Seder and Tish, the 1<sup>st</sup> Day services, the musical Tashlich, and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Day services are distinct events. The Wednesday evening and Thursday afternoon events revolve around food and music. The two services on Thursday and Friday morning differ significantly from each other, so that the second day offers different spiritual opportunities and challenges from the first. We believe you will be moved by each of these New Year's events with Panim Hadashot-New Faces.

### **Rosh Hashannah Seder and Tish, Wednesday evening, September 20<sup>th</sup>**

The Panim Hadshot-New Faces Heart of Shabbat Ensemble shares old and new songs of the Days of Awe for an evening of celebration, spiritual preparation, and community singing in honor of the new year. Rabbi Gartenberg shares some insights about the upcoming days in a beautiful and moving musical introduction to the Days of Awe.

### **First Day Rosh Hashannah Services, Thursday morning, September 21<sup>st</sup>**

The Rosh Hashannah Morning Service blends the traditional chanting of the Hebrew service with sharing of old and new melodies by the Heart of Shabbat Ensemble. The Shofar will blast 100 times. In addition to his Kavanot (brief explorations of the liturgy), Rabbi Gartenberg will offer a sermon that touches on a theme of our times in the framework of Jewish wisdom. Transliterations and translations of the Hebrew service are included.

### **Musical Tashlich-Casting Ceremony, Thursday afternoon, September 21<sup>st</sup>**

We will gather in a protected shelter in Carkeek Park to eat, sing, and cast bread together. Bring your own nosh, and we will provide the symbolic foods and the music.

### **Second Day of Rosh Hashannah, Friday morning, September 22<sup>nd</sup>**

The second day service will be different from the first day. The morning will be divided into two parts: First, a shorter contemplative service combining meditation, chant, and shofar blowing led by Rabbi Dov Gartenberg. The second part will be a text study of the great and troubling portion of the second day, The Binding of Isaac (Genesis, Chapter 22).

### **Feast Before the Fast: Se'udat Hamafseket, Friday afternoon, September 29<sup>th</sup>**

Rabbi Gartenberg has pioneered the revival of ancient Jewish feasts. This feast, which is mentioned in the Talmud, took place in the late afternoon before Kol Nidre. This will be conducted as a seder, a ritual feast, featuring symbolic foods that point to the themes of the Day of Atonement. This meal is wonderful to share with family members and friends. A short "Teshuvah Stroll" will follow the meal to give time to ask forgiveness and or forgive a loved one or just spend some special time with yourself or others before this most awesome day.

We will include renditions of modern poetry, and songs of Leonard Cohen and other artists interspersed with the prayers of the Mahzor. ### **Yom Kippur Morning Services with Yizkor, Saturday morning, September 30<sup>th</sup>**

Yizkor will take place close to 12 pm

The morning Yom Kippur service continues with the themes of sin and repentance from the night before. Yizkor is an opportunity to recall our loved ones who have passed away. We have prepared a service that will move you deeply. A break will follow the end of services from 1-2 pm

### **Yom Kippur Afternoon Study and Conversation Sessions, Saturday afternoon, September 30<sup>th</sup>**

Study and discussion sessions will be offered in the afternoon.

2-3 PM: Spiritual, Moral, and Jewish Resilience in Chaotic Times. Rabbi Gartenberg will share texts in the Jewish tradition that offer insight and stimulate discussion.

3-4 PM: The Book of Jonah, chapter 1. In the afternoon of Yom Kippur we read the Book of Jonah. Chapter 1 confronts the issues of evasion of responsibility, depression, and the relationship between Jews and non-Jews. The discussion should make you forget you are fasting.



### **Yom Kippur Afternoon Services, Saturday afternoon, September 30<sup>th</sup>**

The first hour will focus on the “Avodah” and the “Eleh Ezkerah” sections of Yom Kippur that usually occur earlier in the afternoon. We will explore the issues raised by these services, their spiritual value and challenges. In the second hour we will daven the afternoon service along with reading the Torah and chanting the Book of Jonah.
