Gubernatorial Candidate John Chiang calls for the Resignation of Assemblymember Matt Dababneh

Los Angeles – Gubernatorial candidate John Chiang is urging Assemblymember Matt Dababneh to resign after a second woman has come forward accusing him of sexual misconduct.

“I’m calling for Assemblymember Matt Dababneh's resignation. There should be zero tolerance for sexual harassment in the workplace. We cannot change the culture in Sacramento if we don't remove those in power who abuse it. That's why last week I released a platform on sexual harassment prevention that I will implement as the next governor of California.”

Chiang is the only candidate for governor with a comprehensive plan to prevent sexual abuse and harassment in Sacramento, hold predators accountable, and stand up to those who protect and enable them. Chiang will be donating the contribution Dababneh made to his campaign for Governor and urging other candidates to do the same.

“I commit to changing the culture in Sacramento by changing the makeup of state government to the extent that persons in powers feel they can commit sexual harassment, including assault, and get away with it. I will make it an urgent priority to examine other additional ways to eliminate sexual harassment and assault in state government. My administration will lead by example for all businesses in the state.”
