Students and teachers alike are at the top of his educational platform, as Chiang addresses teacher shortage -- especially in the areas of STEM, special education, and ESL. California has experienced an unprecedented 75% decline in enrollment in teacher preparation programs. Solutions to these issues include student loan forgiveness, helping employees earn bachelor and teaching degrees, and offering residency and mentoring programs that improve teaching performance and increase retention rates.

One of the most prominent highlights of Chiang's education platform is his call to provide two free years of community college where we ensure students are on the right path through participation and graduation.

"The American Dream begins and ends with our ability to access education," stated Chiang. "Today, millions of students are losing out on that dream due to the financial burdens of student debt. Cities and states across the nation are finding ways to provide two free years of community college. California needs to find a way to get to that place."
