Whistleblowing regime in the federal public sector

Blowing the whistle is typically seen as requiring a great deal of courage. However, each of us who has chosen to pursue a career in the public sector should feel that reporting suspected wrongdoings is the right thing to do. This concurrent session will provide an overview of the role and mandate of the Office of the Public Sector Integrity Commissioner as it relates to the federal whistleblower protection regime and aims to raise awareness about the options available to federal public servants who may witness wrongdoing at some point in their career.
