Lessons Learned

- 1) People were at the registration table as soon as it was set up.
- 2) Advertising on Facebook, Austin Statesman, Mazda, and Corvette Club was most effective.
- 3) Getting advertising out three months in advance helped get the word out.
- 4) Using clubregistration.net worked for people with racing background and my email worked for people without the racing background. The registration table worked for both.
- 5) Depending on future routes, the team at the endpoint should be different from the Registration team. If people had not dallied at Luckenbach, the first car would have made Mamacita's before the Rallymaster could drive from Jim's to Fredericksburg.
- 6) The VHF radios were a good idea but apparently don't have the range required for a hill country rally. They might work for an Austin city limits rally.
- 7) An official photographer would have been nice. They could take pictures of each car and team at registration and then of the participants at the end.
