Special Guest Speaker
Leon Rajninger

Leon was born in Czernowitz, Romania (now Ukraine) and was 10 years old when the Nazis invaded in 1941. He and his family were soon deported to a ghetto in the Transnistria region. Leon has published a book about his childhood, entitled *Black Days and Nights*.

The region of Transnistria (beyond the River Dneister) is sometimes referred to as the "forgotten cemetery." The area contained ghettos as well as concentration, transit, labor and annihilation camps. From 1941-1944, over 300,000 Romanian and Ukrainian Jews perished from shooting, starvation, freezing and illness.
