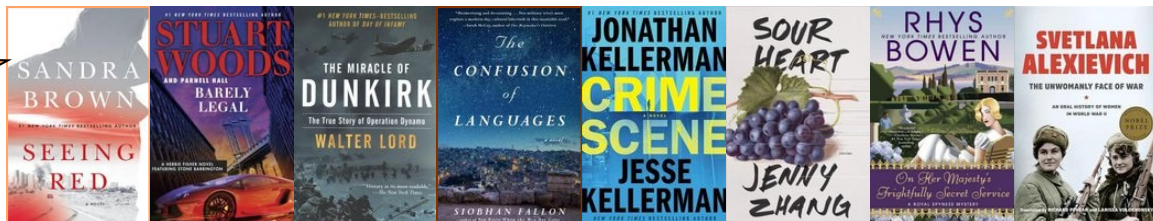

Tuesday, September 26<sup>th</sup>, 6:30 – 7:30pm

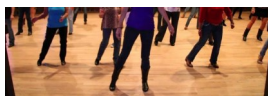
