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## Technical Requirements: “The Road to Little Rock”

The curriculum is being distributed on the North Dakota University System (NDUS) server. Since this is the statewide network, you should have no difficulty accessing the various curriculum components at K-12 schools across the state.

If you do encounter issues with accessing the curriculum, please consult your school district's HELP desk first. Some of the files are large. Give the video files a little time to load before hitting “play”. This gives the files time to *buffer*, or preload on the computer. The video is in an HTML5 compliant format so it runs in the latest Internet browsers.

The website has been tested on the following operating systems: Mac OS; Windows 7 and 8; and, iPad, and the following browsers: Safari; Internet Explorer; Chrome; and, Firefox.
