Demonstrated commitment to working successfully with a diverse student population.
DESIRED/PREFERRED: QUALIFICATIONS	Demonstrated teaching/training experience across the curriculum at BSW and MSW levels; expertise in working with diverse populations; evidence of research competence with publication record; evidence of one or more specialty areas in macro practice such as community organizing, policy analysis, legislative advocacy, program planning and development in community settings, and/or HBSE with the ability to teach students from culturally diverse backgrounds, research and practice experience.
DUTIES:	Teach undergraduate and/or graduate courses related to macro practice/policy which may include community practice, social welfare policy, and administration and/or HBSE courses. Establish a sustained record of research, scholarly and creative activities. Participate in service to the school, college, university, and profession/community.
