The University of Iowa, School of Social Work seeks a clinical assistant professor (academic year appointment) in the Iowa City Campus to coordinate the University's undergraduate Certificate in Critical Cultural Competence (CCCC) Program and to teach Discrimination, Oppression, and Diversity; Foundations of Critical Cultural Competency; and Integrative Seminar in Critical Cultural Competence. The position also involves recruiting, advising and mentoring students in the CCCC Program.

Required qualifications:

- MSW degree from a CSWE accredited program.
- A minimum of three years post-graduate level practice experience.
- Demonstrated potential for teaching courses in cultural competency, diversity, discrimination and oppression.
- Leadership or advocacy experience working with or on behalf of marginalized or oppressed groups.

Desirable qualifications include:

- Potential for professional productivity through activities that might include, but are not limited to, conference presentations, professional consultation, outreach activities, publications, or membership on state or regional boards or professional organizations.
- Five or more years post-graduate level practice experience.
- Demonstrated experience in classroom teaching or training in cultural competency, diversity, discrimination and oppression.

The School of Social Work offers programs at the B.A., M.S.W., and Ph.D. levels with faculty scholarship foci in the areas of aging, child welfare, health and mental health, and culturally competent social work practice. In addition to programs on our main Iowa City campus, we offer a BASW program in Des Moines, and MSW programs in Des Moines, Quad Cities and Sioux City. The School is committed to integrating human diversity and cultural competence in all aspects of teaching and practice.

Please submit a curriculum vitae and/or a detailed resume and a letter of interest with your online application. These letters should address your professional accomplishments, teaching experience and/or teaching potential, and other abilities relevant to the position.
