Fundraiser Bake Sale & Adoption Event July 28th and 29th

Our shelter will be having a Bake Sale fundraiser on July 28th in the [lobby of the administrative office building down town](#) and on July 29th at the [shelter](#) from 10-3PM. We will also have all dogs and puppies available for \$15 adoption fee and cats and kitten will be fee waived on both of these days. All donations taken in at this event will go towards the preventative health care of our shelter pets.

*** All dogs adopted at the FLAS will have a negative heart-worm test and cats will be negative for FIV/leukemia. Both dogs and cats are up to date on vaccines, dewormed, and if not spayed and neutered at the time of adoption a voucher

Hot-Weather-Safety-Tips

- Visit the vet for a spring or early- summer check-up. Make sure your pets get tested for heartworms if they aren't on year-round preventative medication.
- Pets can get dehydrated quickly, so give them [plenty of fresh, clean water](#) when it's hot. Make sure your pets have a shady place to get out of the sun, be careful not to over-exercise them, and keep them indoors when it's extremely hot.
- Never leave your animals alone in a parked vehicle. On a 78-degree day, the temperature inside a parked car can soar to between 100-120 degrees in just minutes, and on a 90-degree day, the interior temperature can reach as high as 160 degrees in less than 10 minutes.
- When the temperature is very high, don't let your dog linger on [hot asphalt](#). Being so close to the ground, your pooch's body can heat up quickly, and sensitive paw pads can burn. Keep walks during these times to a minimum.
