



Topics & Descriptions

Our Conference presents the best of both worlds for professional development - it creates an opportunity for local early learning educators to have access to multiple professional development topics and instructors, but preserves the option for staff from a single program to participate in the same training if desired! Addressing Special Needs and Challenging Behavior: Participants will explore specific adaptations for including children with special needs in their classrooms. Additionally, strategies for addressing persistent and disruptive behaviors will be discussed. This approach uses the PBIS model for classroom management strategies. STARS Standard for Inclusion and Social Emotional.

Aimee's Word Gap App: By age three, children from low-income families are likely to hear 30 million fewer words than their more affluent peers. This is known as the "word gap," and it can have serious consequences for our children. The Word Gap App, a revolutionary idea to solve the word gap problem, uses over 200 high-definition video clips to demonstrate positive interactions between parent and child. Extremely user-friendly, the Word Gap App addresses the importance of managing the stress of a new parent, providing tips on asking for help, and a database of national resources to help any new parent. This is not an App for babies, but for the caregiver of children.

When you open the app, choose from either English or Spanish or switch back and forth between the two languages to manage stress, watch videos and learn the words to over 100 nursery rhymes and original songs to use to interact with your child. Please bring a tablet or smart phone to this session. STARS Standard for linguistically diverse children.

Building Relationships with Children and Families

Based on the CSEFEL Positive Behavior Support Model, participants will learn about building positive relationships with children and adults. [**STARS Standard for interactions.**](#)

Effectively Using Assessment Tools: Participants will explore using a variety of assessment tools that will help develop a child's portfolio. We will demonstrate lesson planning, entering observations, assessing children's growth and development, creating portfolios and family conference forms. (emphasis on GOLD) [**STARS Standard for observation based assessment.**](#)

ELL101: Introduction to Working with English Language Learners in ECE

As we welcome all cultures into our programs we must be prepared to work with children and families that are learning to speak English. Although it can be challenging and scary, it doesn't have to be if you know what to expect and what to do. In this session, you'll be introduced to the process of learning English as a second language and walk out with specific things to do (and not do) when working with ELL children and families. [**STARS Standard for inclusion and diverse language learners.**](#)

How to Support English Language Learners and Dual Language Learners in Early Childhood

During this professional development session participants will begin to gain an understanding of the various characteristics of ELL/DLL children and their families. Participants will learn how young children learn a second language and the stages of language acquisition. Best practices and effective strategies for working with English Language Learners and Dual Language Learners and their families will be discussed as well as ways to begin to engage families in your program. [**STARS Standard for inclusion and diverse language learners.**](#)

Infant Massage and Developmental Exercises

In this session we will explore the benefits of infant massage and come away with practical ways to incorporate this responsive and relationship building practice into your everyday moments for infants. Please bring a large baby doll with you to this session.

STARS 101 and 102

It is an introduction to the idea of Continuous Quality Improvement which is the basic premise for the Keystone STARS Quality Rating System. In addition to the philosophy of CQI, the process of change and how to begin your journey through the Keystone STARS system will be discussed. The following elements of assessing and building quality will be covered: Pennsylvania Core Knowledge Competencies and Big Ideas Framework, Continuous Quality Improvement, PA Early Learning Standards, Caring for our Children Basics (CFOCB) as a resource and supporting interactions with children and families. [**This course meets the requirement for STAR 2 SQ.2.1 Part 1 and Part 2.**](#)

The Basics of Creative Curriculum

Participants will explore how the environment, teacher and family work together to provide a solid foundation for early learning experiences. Additionally, participants will learn how to manage their classrooms, create lesson plans, and systematically observe children using the Creative Curriculum Framework. [STARS Standard for curriculum PD.](#)

The Social And Emotional Lives Of Toddlers: Why Are They So Challenging?

Being a toddler is hard, being a toddler's teacher is harder! Come learn about the many changes that are taking place in your wonderful toddlers and how we, as teachers, can support them. Participants will gain insight into what is going on inside these wonderful, active and challenging children. [STARS Standard for social emotional development.](#)

Typical Characteristics of Children with Autism

In this professional development session participants will be provided with information on autism spectrum disorders. We will discuss the symptoms, early signs, and sensory issues related to autism spectrum disorders. Participants will then discuss basic strategies for working with children who have been diagnosed as being on the autism spectrum. [STARS Standard for inclusion.](#)

Understanding the Strengthening Families Protective Factors Framework

This course is based on a strength-based approach to working with families. The focus is the five protective factors: parent resilience, social connections, knowledge of parenting & child development, concrete support in time of need and social emotional competence. Come to this event to get resources and supports in your work with families. [STARS Standard.](#)

Using Ages and Stages Questionnaire as a Screening Tool

Participants will learn how to use the ASQ® and ASQ:SE® as a screening tool for children ages 3 months to 5 years. The session provides information on how to administer and score the screener and share results of the screener with families. Including resources for making referrals to additional services if needed. [STARS Standard for Screening Tool.](#)

Please note that it is the responsibility of each staff member to sign-in to sessions they attend in order to earn PQAS credit and Act 48 credit.
