2019 World Para-Nordic Skiing Championships will be hosted in Canada



The Caledonia Nordic Ski Club in Prince George, British Columbia has been selected to host the 2019 World Para-Nordic Skiing Championships. The event is expected to take place in February 2019, with approximately 140 athletes from over 20 countries worldwide competing in cross-country skiing and biathlon events. The event will be the first international-level sporting event hosted in Prince George, as the town successfully hosted the Canada Winter Games in 2015. The event provides an amazing opportunity for Canadian athletes to experience world-class competition on home soil.

Samuel Charron named 2016 Paralympic Soccer Player of the Year



We would like to congratulate 18-year old Samuel Charron (pictured to the left) for being selected as the 2016 Canadian Para Soccer Player of the Year by the Canadian Para Soccer coaching staff. Charron played a vital leadership role for the Canadian team at the 2016 IFCPF Qualification Tournament in Denmark, and his performance helped Canada clinch a spot for the 2017 IFCPF World Championships. Charron is currently ranked second of all-time in program history with 27 goals and 12 assists, a remarkable performance for 31 international matches over a five-year period.
