When you need to speak with a government worker about your disability benefits, how is that experience for you?

We are leading up to an election in May of 2017, what would you like the parties to promise people with disabilities? What would you like their platform to include that would affect your life?

The BC government announced that they want BC to be the most progressive province in Canada for people with disabilities, what do you think they need to do to reach that goal?

Do you feel people with disabilities have a voice that is heard in BC? If not, what message would you like to be heard?

What is life like with a disability in BC?

Do you have any additional thoughts?
