### The Five Behaviours of a Cohesive Dental Team

#### Overview: *The single most untapped competitive advantage is teamwork!*

THE FIVE BEHAVIORS OF A COHESIVE TEAM is an assessment based learning experience that helps reveal what it takes to build a truly cohesive and effective team in the most approachable, competent, and effective way possible. Bringing together everyone's personalities and preferences to form a cohesive, productive team takes work, but the payoff can be huge—for individuals, the team, and the organization. To gain this advantage teams must:

- **Trust One Another** – When team members are genuinely transparent and honest with one another, they are able to build vulnerability based trust
- **Engage in Conflict Around Ideas** – When there is trust, team members are able to engage in unfiltered, constructive debate of ideas.
- **Commit to Decisions** – When team members are able to offer opinions and debate ideas, they will be more likely to commit to decisions.
- **Hold One Another Accountable** – When everyone is committed to a clear plan of action, they will be more willing to hold one another accountable.
- **Focus on Achieving Collective Results** – The ultimate goal of building greater trust, conflict, commitment, and accountability is on the achievement of results.

### Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS Certification)

Pat Evangelisto CRRP



**Overview:** Participants will gain knowledge in the following areas: Introduction to the Occupational Health and Safety Act; What is the purpose of WHMIS; Identification and exclusion of products covered by WHMIS; Different classes of hazardous materials and how to identify them; Purpose of Labelling – supplier and workplace; Material Safety Data Sheets, including How to read them; Identifying the relevant information; Using the MSDS to protect the worker; What to do in the event of an emergency; and, First Aid considerations.

This course has been customized for people who provide denture/dental services, highlighting products they use on a regular basis. We will discuss the health and safety hazards of these products along with ways the manufacturers recommend that workers be protected.

Testing is mandatory under law and a test will be conducted at the end of the program, which complies with the legislation. Each participant will receive course material and a certificate of participation recognizing that they are trained as per the Occupational Health and Safety Act.

## Physiologic Complete Dentures: From Conventional Overdentures to Fixed Implant Support

Dennis Purinton CDT

**Overview:** This is a technical lecture for education purposes, NOT a hands-on session.

Many patients with missing natural teeth believe implant dentures will be a better solution to their chewing problems and pain. And as a dentist and/or removable technician, you have encountered challenging conventional and implant denture cases requiring complex set-up and processing techniques to address a functioning yet esthetic outcome. Fabrication of dentures can be precise and methodical when provided jaw relationship measurements via Face Bow, Arch Tracings, or Facial Analyzer information. But what happens when the information is lacking or just not communicated? The ability to manually treatment plan for the edentulous patient becomes critical and theory of rehabilitation becomes reality to have success. This program addresses the fusion between patient desire, jaw relationship needs, occlusal function, ridge and/or implant supported dentures and proper treatment planning to create long-term successful dentures. Common issues of chewing difficulties, breakage of denture base material, tooth fracture and retention elements every few months will also be discussed.

- How the anatomical features and ridge form and arch classification help dictate tooth position
- Understand the concept of where teeth go in space.
- Proper case planning and how to prevent and/or correct common implant denture set-up mistakes.
- Treatment planning for implant esthetics and function.
- Why the choice of denture tooth cuspal inclinations make a difference.
- Understanding of how the right denture tooth form helps minimize complications
- Learn proper tooth arrangements and occlusal schemes fitted for implant dentures
